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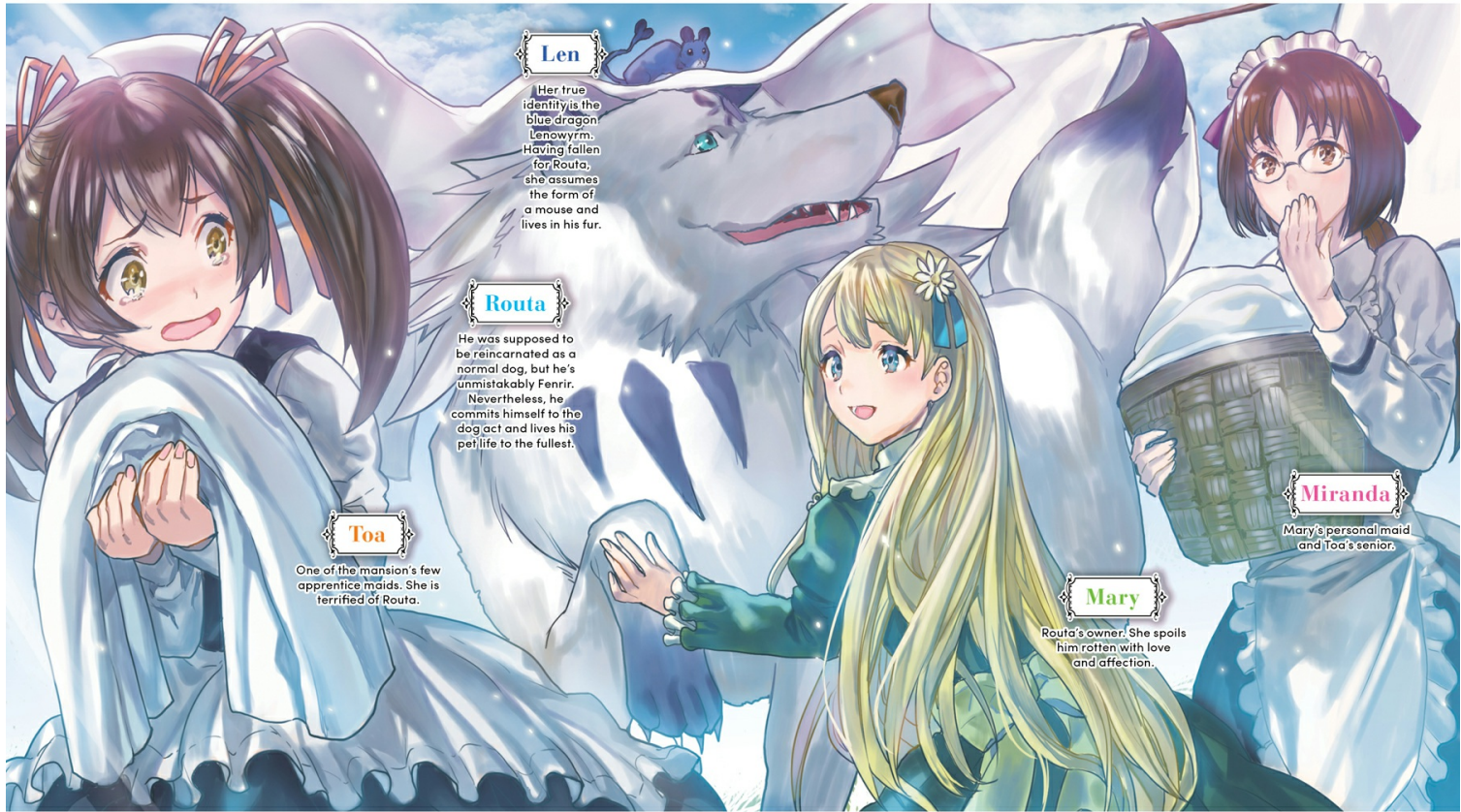
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EPILOGUE ...

Len burrows into my mane, and Nahura leaves to find a sunny spot.

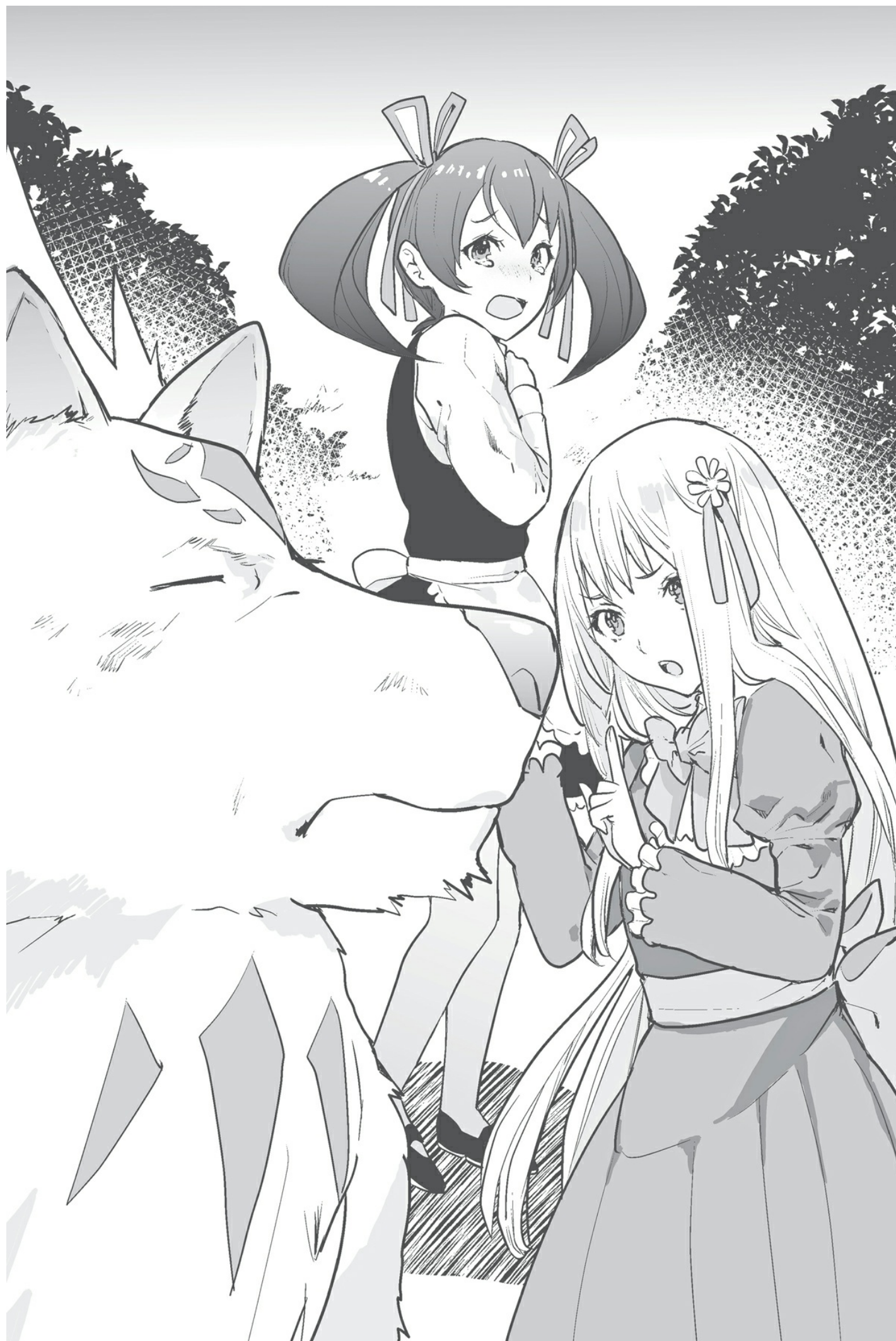
Which leaves me alone with the sniffing maid.

She’s wearing a beautiful dress, but standing so high above us means that when the wind blows, we can see *everything*.

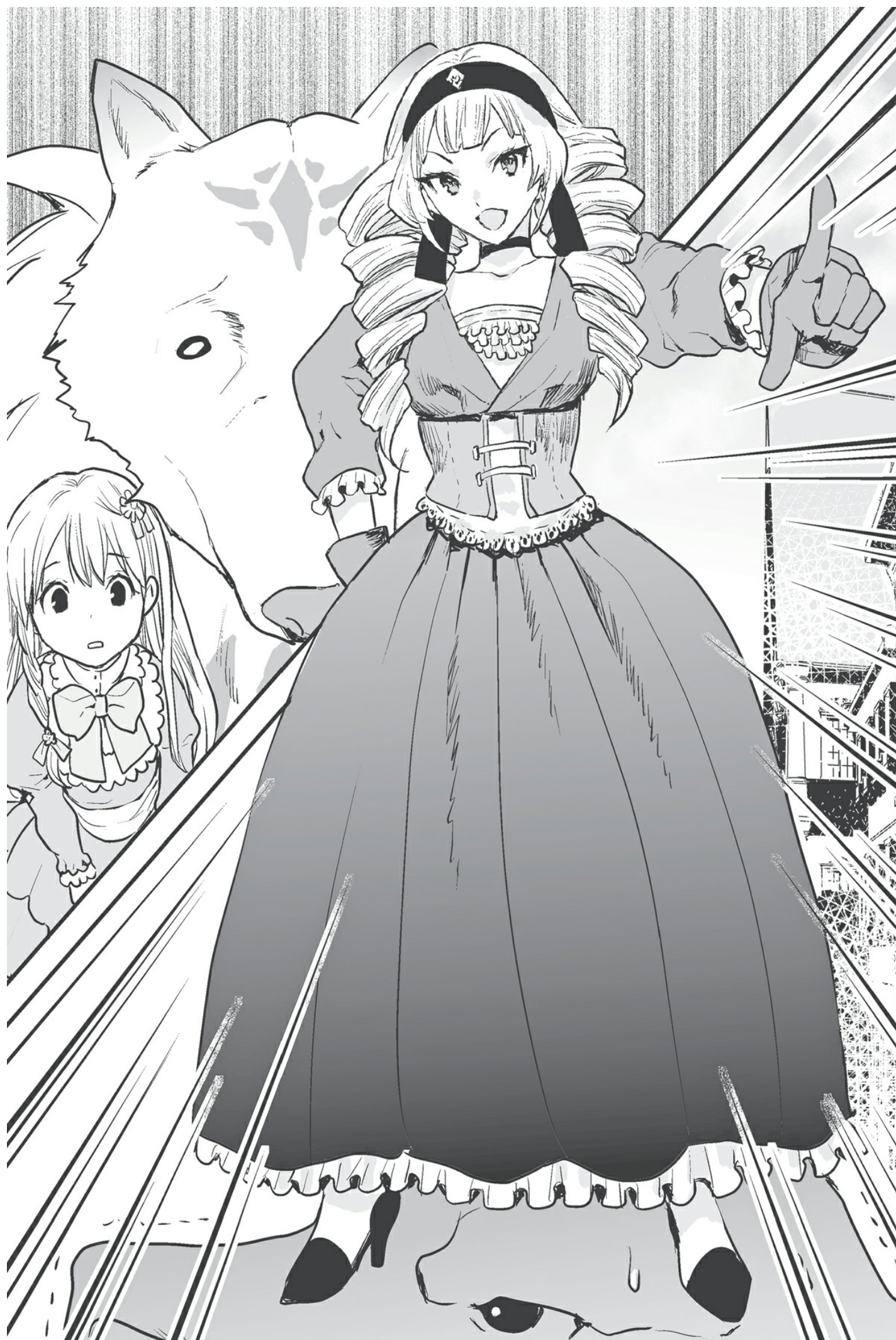

“Woof. (I sure don’t. I’m a dog.)”

I am a natural-born pet, gifted with extreme laziness.

“Mrow. (You’re late, Routa. I’ve already completed my mission.)”

I look in the direction of the voice and see a cat perched on the kitchen’s windowsill, the moon in full view behind her.

A wine bottle and some glasses are orbiting her.

“Arwf! (Oh! Nice one, Nahura!)”

The fact that Nahura already has the booze means I was right to enlist her aid.

“Squeak! (You’re at fault, too, you bad cat! Don’t you dare seduce my husband!)”

“M-mrow! (I-it’s not what it looks like, Lady Len! Routa was the one who said we should have a party!)”

Nahura’s a cat, but she *hates* mice. Just one squeak from Len, and she jumps out of the window in fear.

“Squeak! (Hold it! You need to be punished!)”

“Meeew! (Nooo! Don’t bite my eaaaars!!)”

The two of them run around and around the tree in the middle of the garden.

“Woof, woof... (Hey! I’m going to eat all the ham without yoooouuuu...!)”

I watch the mouse chase the cat in the moonlit garden as I sink my teeth into the fatty ham.



Nom, nom.

Mm, it’s hard and bitter.

I’m not sure if it’s the curing process or what, but this ham is surprisingly tough.

Even if I bite through the skin, there’s a thick layer of fat waiting for me.

“Mrow. (Routa, biting into it like that is so uncivilized...meow.)”

Why does she keep correcting herself like that? She was talking normally before.

She’s meowing normally, so saying “meow” at the end of the sentence doesn’t mean anything.

“Arww? (Awww. I can’t eat it yet?)”

The popping sensation from the raspberries further adds to the eating experience. I’m looking forward to trying them with the drink.

"Woof, woof! (Oh? Really? You don't want any? Then I guess we'll just have to gobble it all up. Nahura!)"

"Meow! (Okaaaay!)"

We leave Len alone and devour the raspberry ham without her.

"Arwf! (It's so good! Delicious!)"

"Mew! (Mmm, truly exquisite!)"

The cured ham disappears slice after slice.

Len simply watches us in frustration.

"S-squee... (...Damn it. I—I don't need any of it...)"

She begins to cry.

This thousand-year-old spinster who always acts so high-and-mighty is actually a kid deep down.

Back when I first snuck into her nest for the wyrmnil, and she tried to act so welcoming, she was probably just masking her loneliness.

Oh geez, we should probably stop bullying her.

"Woof, woof. (Okay, I'm sorry. We'll stop teasing you. Please stop crying, Len.)"

"Squeak! (I-I-I'm not crying!)"

Len snaps back even as a raspberry wrapped in a piece of ham is offered to her.

"Mew. (Here you go, Len.)"

This piece of meat has been cut to look like a flower.

“Mrow. (Sorry for being so mean, Lady Len. We went too far.)”

“Squeak! (H-hmph! It’s not like I was crying or anything! I’m not even angry! Nor can it be said that I desire to have a piece, either!)”

Hecate, the star of the show, appears at last.

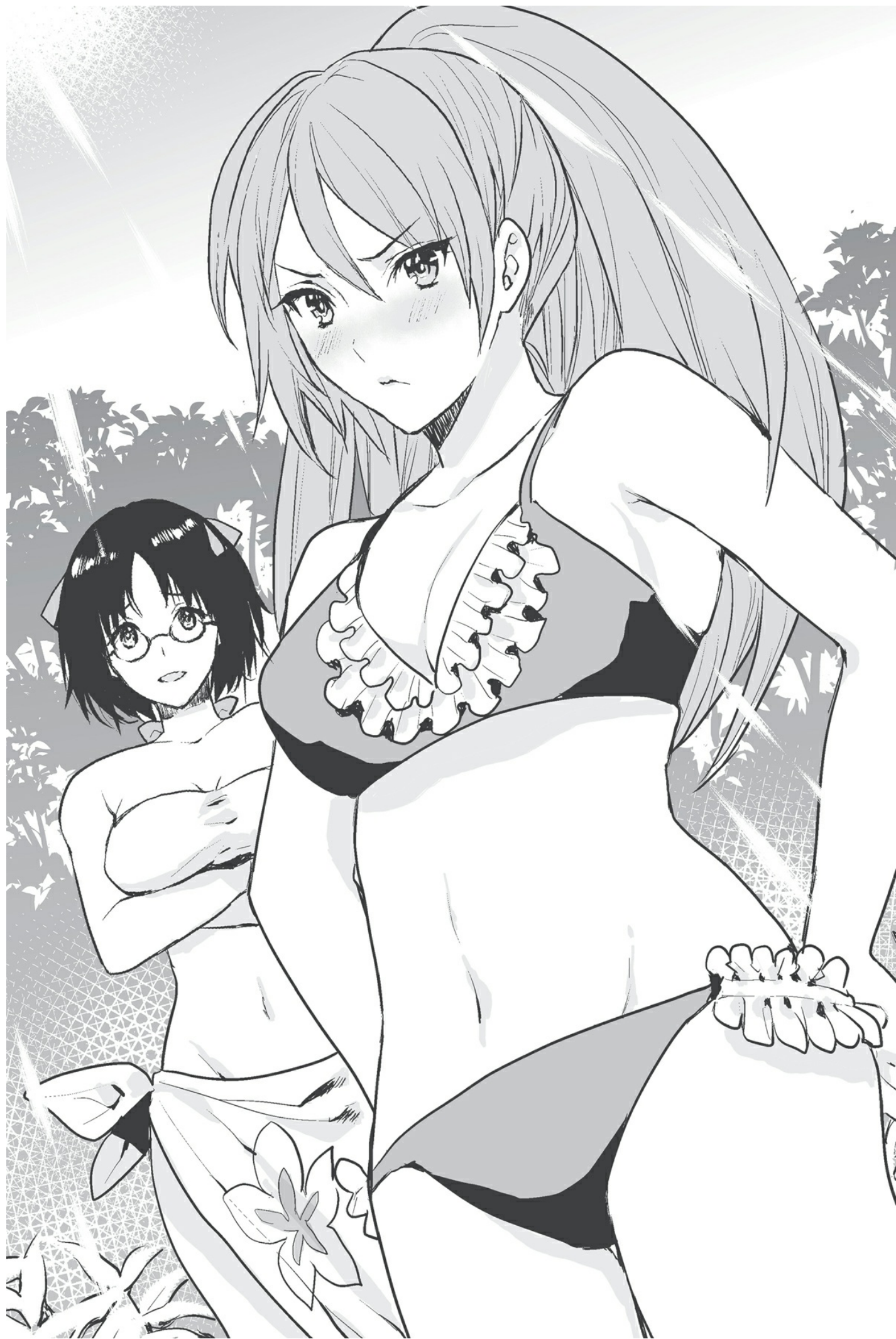
Her long silver hair flows behind her as she struts over. It isn't long before I become fixated on one generous detail.

She’s worried they’ll get in her way when she’s all alone out here with the laundry.

“Arwf. (Okay, Toa. I get what you’re trying to say. Just leave it to me.)”

I get up and conceal Toa from the adventurers. This way, she won’t be able to see the adventurers, and all they’ll be able to see are her feet.

I feel like this is the first time my body’s size is actually useful for something.

“Th-thanks...”

She practically whispers it.

“Arwf. (No problem.)”

But I’m going to run for it if they do decide to mess with us. You better not expect me to fight or anything. I’m scared of them, too. They’re all muscly.

“I’ll be quick.”

“Arwf. (Don’t worry about it. Take your time. This lazy hound has nothing better to do.)”

I walk with her, acting as a shield, over to the washing line near the adventurers.

“H-hey, you!”

Wait. They're suddenly picking a fight?!

"Get away from her!"

"Arwf?! (*Who? Me?!*)"

I thought Papa told them about me!

"Don't pretend you didn't see us, you monster! Get away from the girl!"

"Wh-what do you want this time?! Do you have a problem with our dog?!"

Hiding behind me, Toa raises her voice.

I'm sure she's terrified, but she moves to my side to protect me and puffs out her chest.

I can see her legs shaking, but she carries herself with authority.

"Don't say something so foolish. How is this giant beast a dog...?"

"I've never seen such a huge, terrifying dog before!"

"Miss, please step away from it and come here. He's clearly a monster...!"

The adventurers are wary of me and aren't stepping any closer.

Toa, struck by their words, glares back at them with tears in her eyes.

"Routa... Routa isn't a monster!"

Toa protests, clinging on to my fur with a trembling hand so she doesn't fall over.

It's okay, Toa. You're not alone.

Their weapons are aimed at me, so even *my* legs are trembling like a baby deer's.

"Routa is the young lady's, this household's, precious dog!"



T-Toa...! You're such a good girl...! Such a good, good girl...!

You're terrified, but you still spoke on my behalf!

"Woof! Woof! (Yeah! I'm their pet! Which means I'm Faulks property, got it?! It'll be bad if you lay a hand on me, got it?! You'll pay, got it?! Your monthly income doesn't even come close to how much you'll pay, right?!)"

I bark with all my might, even as I lie belly-up in total submission.

"Squee.....? (Should you really be issuing such a threat, beloved...?)"

It's fine.

Besides, they don't understand what I'm saying.

I'm just channeling my doggy appeal by looking submissive and barking.

"C-Captain. If it really is this mansion's dog, then we can't touch it..."

"Tch. Fine, then. Put your weapons away. This monster... This dog isn't threatening anyone."

The adventurers put their weapons away as their captain commands.

"I just don't understand nobles... That dog must be pretty strong."

"I guess there's no problem if it's tame."

"I've never heard of a monster being tamed by humans, though."

Uwah, they still suspect me.

I hope they don't report me along with Zenobia...

In the end, there is one hiccup, but I complete my role as Toa's shield, and she finishes collecting the laundry.

"Oh, Routa. You don't need to wait for me. This is my job, after all."

"Arwf. (It's fine; don't worry about it.)"

I take the surprisingly heavy basket in my mouth and head for the back door.

"Wait a minute, miss."

A voice calls out from behind, causing Toa to jump and hide behind me.

“Wh-what is it?”

“Well. We’re sorry for what happened at the gate. We’ll be out of your hair by tomorrow. I know we scared you, but please don’t be afraid of us.”

The captain bows his head in apology.

Hmm. He doesn’t seem like a bad guy.

I guess it’s not impossible for a large man to lower his head to a servant in this world. And I suppose he did make an honest attempt to save her before.

He might look scary, but he’s a good guy.

“Arwf. *(Maybe the two of us aren’t so different.)*”

“Squee... *(I’m not even going to comment...)*”

Maybe I should go to the forest tonight and talk to Garo and the others before tomorrow.

Which reminds me... The whole reason the adventurers are here in the first place is to investigate something in the forest.

We leave the mansion in the dead of night and head deep into the forest.

“Squeak. (What are they after? They probably wish to investigate the remains of our battle.)”

The blue mouse Len rides atop my head, casually answering my question.

“Woof? (The remains of our fight? You mean your nest behind that huge waterfall?)”

“Squea. (That’s right. It’s because of the high level of magic used when you and I clashed. It’s caused the magic concentration in the area to rise.)”

Hmm? Hecate and Chief Emerada mentioned something like that in the Royal Capital. I don’t really remember it, though.

“Bark? (What happens when the concentration of magic increases?)”

“Squea. (Nothing good if you leave it alone. The surrounding ecosystem goes crazy, and labyrinths may appear. If the magic doesn’t disperse, then it could coalesce and create a powerful monster.)”

“Bark. (What? That sounds like a problem.)”

“Squee. (That’s probably what those humans are here to investigate. We did emit a lot of magic. As long as they travel with a mage, they’ll be able to observe from a distance.)”

Oh, I see—they talked about that, too.

So those adventurers they mentioned being on a special investigation...would be these guys.

It’s been less than two weeks since my fight with Len in the cave.

From the time they first detected the phenomenon to identifying the point of origin, getting the best adventurers for the job, and dispatching them all the

way out here. All of that must have taken about ten days.

That's a speedy reaction. This world's reaction time is impressive.

"Squeak? (Hmm, but our magic combining and creating a monster... Would it be going too far to think of it as our child?)"

Yes.

That would be going much too far.

Wouldn't that be on the same level as immaculate conception? Just ignore it, Routa.

"Arwf? (Could any of those terrible things have happened already?)"

"Squea. (No, not yet. Just because the magic concentration is high doesn't mean anything would have happened this soon. If the magic disperses, then it would take even longer for a monster to appear.)"

"Woof. (All right, then we'll go disperse it. ASAP.)"

"Squeak! (What?! You want to murder our child before it's even born?! No! I want to keep it!)"

"Woof! (Whoa! This conversation just went from zero to one hundred in no time at all! All I'm saying is that we need to take care of the potential threat before it becomes a problem!)"

And please don't call it "our child"!

I haven't even done anything yet, but I'm already feeling really conflicted!



"Awooooooo! (Come on out, you guys!)"

I summon the Fen Wolves from my usual cliff. As usual, they show up immediately.

I look at the pack orderly lined up under the giant crescent moon.

It's a spectacular sight.

It doesn't look like everyone is here, but seeing a few hundred Fen Wolves lined up like trained soldiers makes me think they'll be a force to be reckoned

with.

“Grwl! (Attention! The king is to appoint us with a mission! Be grateful for the opportunity to serve!)”

The wolves all stand at attention at Garo’s order, and their eyes focus on me.

“Squeak. (Mwa-ha-ha, this is more like it. It feels pretty good to stand next to my darling, who has so many retainers serving him.)”

“Next to”? You’re sitting on my head.

“Bark. (Hey, thanks for coming, everyone. I have some introductions to make before we get started.)”

The Fen Wolves hang on my every word.

“Squeak. (Hmph, an introduction? Then it is important that they see me as I truly am. Very well. I grant them the privilege of laying eyes upon my resplendent visage.)”

Len leaps high off the top of my head and transforms.

The tiny mouse spins around a few times midair and, a moment later, has turned into a giant blue dragon. Her massive wings flap once, and she lands behind me.

The Fen Wolves stir at the sight of the giant that suddenly appears before them.

“Grwl...?! (A d-dragon...?! The king has subdued a dragon and made it serve him...?!)”

Garo’s astonishment is matched by a number of the wolves crying “Long live the king!” but I’ll ignore it for now.

“Woof. (Nahura, are you there? You should come out, too.)”

“Mrow! (Okaaaay, here I come!)”

When I call her, a hole appears in the air, and out pops a crimson cat.

She gently lands on the ground next to me as if she weighs nothing at all.

“Grwl. (Tch, it’s you, Nahura.)”

“Mew! (Oh, Garo. Long time no see!)”

Seems like Garo and Nahura know each other. Maybe it's from their mutual interactions with Hecate?

“Woof. (Looks like you already know at least one of them, but let me introduce them to you anyway. The big one behind me is Lenowym. The cat next to me is Nahura.)”

Len poses arrogantly, and Nahura snuggles up to me.

“GROOAR. (I'm his wife.)”

“Meow. (And I'm his lover. ♪)”

A stir runs through the crowd of Fen Wolves at this misunderstanding.

“G-grwl?! (You have a queen and a mistress of different speciiiiieees?!)”

A brown-furred wolf leaps forward.

It's Garo's aide, Bal.

We met during the incident with the boar.

“Grwl! Grwl! (Your Majesty! What is the meaning of this?! Your betrothed should clearly be Lady Garo! How can you be dissatisfied with the strong and beautiful princess?!)”

That's because I'm *really* not a furry.

Not that they'll understand what I'm talking about, so I don't say anything.

Garo's spirit has already left her body from shock. I'd feel bad if I did any more damage.

“Woof, woof. (Wait, Bal. These two are just joking. Don't take them seriously.)”

“GROOAR. (It is no jest. I am truly serious.)”

“Mew. (I can tell it's what Routa truly wants.)”

It's really not what I want; *please* shut up.

Please don't make them regret following me.

“Woof. (That is absolutely not it. These two are my friends. I don’t want any fighting. Any talks of wives or anything is ridiculous. Ignore them.)”

“.....Grwl. (...Understood. I believe you, Your Highness...)”

Bal doesn’t seem convinced, but he accepts my explanation anyway and returns to the line.

“Woof. (Well, now that that’s settled, Garo, let’s have a chat.)”

Garo returns to her senses when I call out to her.

“Grwl! (Huh?! Attention! The king is to appoint us with a mission! Be grateful for the opportunity to serve!)”

She barks the exact same command as before.

Apparently, Garo intentionally forgot everything that just happened. I think she wiped the last few minutes from her memory.

“Woof. (The truth is, humans will soon enter the forest. Four of them.)”

“Grwl! (And you want us to kill them all! Of course, my king! Leave it to us! We Fen Wolves pride ourselves on devouring our prey until not even the bones remain!)”

“Woof! Woof! (No! No! No! No! I’m telling you not to lay a paw on them!)”

Seriously, their extreme bloodlust is going to cause problems one day.

Their “Kill all humans!” mentality is terrifying.

I’m going to have to feed them the old man’s food again and remind them of how wonderful humans are.

Old man James’s cooking is the foundation for peace.

“Woof, woof. (They just need to make sure there’s nothing weird going on in the forest, and then they’ll leave.)”

If they do identify an issue within the forest, then I’m sure more adventurers will come. And that’ll be the end of my peaceful pet life.

I’ll be stripped of my pet status and downgraded to monster. I can’t let that happen, no matter what.

“Woof, woof! *(Your mission is to escort them. Give them full protection without them noticing.)*”

“Grwl... *(Yes, if my king commands...)*”

The general mood seems to be “It’s unpleasant to have humans doing as they please in our territory,” but they’ll simply have to put up with it.

It’s all for the greater good of the forest.

Everyone has to pool their strengths and work together!

“GRAR... *(This is clearly for your own selfish reasons.)*”

“Mrow. *(You really are a simple creature, Routa.)*”

Shut up.

I’ll just ignore those two smart-asses.

Woof. *(All right then, now for the plan name.)*”

I pause for effect and raise my commanding voice.

“Woof! *(Commence Operation “They Thought It Was Going to Be a Lengthy Investigation, but It Turned Out to Be a Super-Easy Bath Trip. Drip, Drop”!!)*”



Dawn hasn’t even broken yet when the party of A-Rank adventurers packs away their camp and sets off on their forest investigation.

In the early summer, the trees are thick with leaves, so the moonlight doesn’t reach the forest floor.

Their way is lit only by the lanterns on their hips.

“Captain, we seem to be on the right path. The large amount of magical damage that the Institute of Magical Research detected is still strong. The Magic Dowsing Stone is pointing straight north.”

The way is led by a man holding the small device that points them in the right direction. He has both a short and long dagger on the back of his waist and a soft leather hood over his head. The entire party is equipped with mostly lightweight armor for long-distance travel, but his clothes are especially light.

He has likely reduced his weight as much as possible so he can do his job as a ranger.

“This forest has been unexplored for a thousand years. I’ve heard that no monsters appear because of the sacred lake, but be on your guard anyway. There must be a powerful monster residing here for that much magical damage to occur.”

The captain with a claymore on his back follows shortly behind.

He’s a beefy guy standing at an impressive height. He’s probably a swordsman.

The man behind the captain nods in response to his warning.

“Good point. We’re a well-balanced party for clearing labyrinths and exploring new regions, but we’re all A-Rank adventurers. I think they expected us to have a few encounters when they sent us here.”

This man, wearing a priestlike robe and cape, checks the spiked club he’s holding. His skinny frame makes him look more like a librarian than an adventurer.

“Well, a monster that spawns from a labyrinth’s magic is one thing, but one that appears aboveground shouldn’t be difficult.”

The man with a short pike pipes up from the back of the group.

“You should stay on guard anyway. You can’t rely on talent alone.”

The deep-voiced lancer suddenly scrunches up his face.

“Captain, we’ve got company. Five hundred paces that way, but it’s heading this way.”

“You’ve got good ears, but we’re not changing course. The objective point is our priority. We’ll head in a straight line and eliminate anything we come across.”

“Yes, sir.”

“Understood.”

“Got it.”

They ready their weapons, and the captain nods at his stalwart companions.

The adventurers continue cautiously but without letting their speed waver.

Only a few dozen steps from the enemy.

Now that they're closer, they can sense it's a vicious creature.

"We might have some trouble with this one..."

Just as the ranger leading the way groans—the forest trembles.

In the blink of an eye, they sense a strong murderous intent, and then their adversary's aura vanishes.

"Wha—?!"

What just happened?

Right as they were about to come into contact with the source, it simply vanished.

Maybe it cloaked its presence?

No, were that the case, it would have done so earlier. It's impossible for a creature to hide its aura this close up unless it's a creature of incredible power.

And what was that aura of murderous intent that seemed to make the entire forest tremble...?

"What just happened?!"

"I don't know. Let's press on!"

The adventurers pick up the pace and head to the location where the enemy should be.

They flatten grass, squeeze past trees, and trample roots, but when they finally arrive, there's nothing there. Not even a trace of the enemy that should have been there. An ominous breeze blows through the forest.

"C-Captain..."

"Don't panic. There really is something in this forest... Stay on your guard, everyone."

The adventurers all gulp as they start to have second thoughts about this

investigation.



“Arwf. (Good, good. Everything is proceeding according to plan. Excellent, excellent.)”

I nod at how well things are going as I watch the adventurers advancing with their weapons drawn.

The Fen Wolves have currently surrounded the adventurers, acting as their secret bodyguards. The rigorous guard of a few hundred wolves is so great that not a single monster can get in.

Even the monster that appeared before was swiftly taken care of by Garo’s unit.

It was devoured in seconds.

Not a single cry was heard, nor was there any leftover gore to examine.

Impressive as always. The adventurers should be able to continue their investigation in total safety.

I also asked Garo about the monsters we released from Drills’s place, and if she accidentally hunted them, but it seems they successfully relayed my message to her and are now living peacefully elsewhere in the forest.

It appears they’ve taken a liking to a forest rich with magic and lacking in enemies, and they won’t be coming this way at all.

“Squeak. (I see. I understand your plan now, my darling. You want a land where these humans do not come in contact with even a single monster.)”

“Woof. (Exactly. If we can keep them from running into any monsters, then those guys should go home quickly, right?)”

“Mrow. (And while that happens, our secret plan is to go on ahead to the waterfall and disperse the magic.)”

Exactly. For once, we’re all on the same page.

Now the adventurers can enjoy a safe journey.

I’ll need to prepare a wonderful surprise along the way.

At their current pace, we're sure to arrive at the waterfall way before them, but I might have to set some extra time aside just in case.

"Woof! (All right then, we're going on ahead. I'm leaving the adventurers' well-being in your paws, everyone!)"

""""Grwl! (Just leave it to us, O king!)""""

I call to the Fen Wolves behind me and then head off to execute the next phase of the plan.



Shadows. All they see are shadows.

The moment they get close to sensing a monster, merciless shadows fly by.

When they finally get to the spot where the monster is supposed to be, they find nothing.

An ominous feeling washes over them, and they're stricken with fear.

"Wh-what in the world is going on...?!"

"C-Captain. Shouldn't we withdraw for now...?!"

The ranger and priest cry out in bewilderment.

"This really is strange, Captain... I feel like something's been watching us this entire time. But I can't put my finger on it. I've never felt anything like this before..."

The lancer, with the skill to sense magic over a wide area, can't even sense their opponent.

No one's been injured, but it's reason enough to withdraw.

If this were an ordinary quest, even the captain would consider retreating. But this investigation was a request from the guild.

They can't go back without gathering some information, at the very least. If they leave now, they won't have learned anything.

"...We press on. Lady Emerada said this situation had the potential to evolve into a national disaster. This investigation must be seen through, even if we have to give our lives for it."

“...Huh. So we might die.”

“What are you saying? You were prepared for this the moment you signed up as an adventurer.”

“I’d hoped to at least make captain one day.”

The adventurers nod at one another, preparing themselves for a heroic end, then press on.

With newfound resolve burned into their souls, they begin their do-or-die adventure.



“Woof. (You know, I bet those guys are starting to feel pretty bummed over how easy this job is.)”

“Squeak. (Probably. Investigating a forest without monsters is just too easy.)”

“Meow. (What fortunate adventurers. They’ll be able to complete their mission simply by walking.)”

With the adventurers being protected by Garo and the others, I sprint north with Len on my head and Nahura on my back.

“Arwf... (Oh, it looks like dawn’s almost here...)”

The sky peeking through the treetops is starting to transition from a dark ultramarine to the light crimson of dawn.

I need to get back to bed before Lady Mary wakes up.

“Woof? (Let’s head back for today. Nahura, if you please?)”

“Mew! (Got it. All right then, let’s take the anchor off Rوتا for now and set it to this location. That way, we’ll be able to teleport here next time!)”

Nahura’s abilities are so useful.

It’s like she has a magical door that can take her anywhere she wants to go.

Nahura meows once, and white space spreads out around us. In the next moment, we’re in the mansion’s garden.

“Arwf. (All right, see you later. We’ll meet up again tonight.)”

“Mrow? (That’s fine by me. However, you do know we see each other every mealtime, right?)”

“Woof! Woof! (I keep telling you those are my meals! Stop eating them like you’re entitled to all my food!)”

Nahura heads for Hecate’s workshop, her tail bobbing from side to side.

Damn it. She’s definitely going to be picking from my plate all day.

I sigh and head back to my lady’s room.

I sneak through the kitchen from the back door, then head down the corridor and up the stairs to the second floor from the main entryway. Finally, I tiptoe to her room in the west wing, using my forepaw to pull down the doorknob and enter as quietly as I can.

My lady is sleeping soundly as always.

“Arwf... (I’m home...)”

I wriggle under the duvet.

One problem with this giant canopy bed is that my legs stick out on one end when I lie down. And it’s started to creak whenever I climb in.

I need to do something about that, but first, sleep. I’ll think about it later.

I continue up through the covers, and my head pops out next to my lady’s.

“Hmm... Routa...”

She reaches out subconsciously and hugs me.

“Arww. (Here I am, my lady.)”

She hugs me tight, and I’m filled with the joy of being home.

I’ll do anything to protect this life. I’ll even get those adventurers there and back again safely.

All right then, time to sleep until morning.

I feel a little anxious about the creaking of the bed, but I’m asleep before I know it.



“Huff...huff... No more...”

The ranger at the head of the party finally falls to his knees.

“Captain... I can’t take it anymore... I can’t go on...”

It’s not just him. The whole party is exhausted.

They’re being watched by numerous eyes. But they can’t tell where they are. Their observers don’t seem to be enemies, but they’re certainly not friendly, either. The endless gazes continue chipping away at their sanity.

A whole day has passed since they set foot in the forest, but they haven’t had a single battle. There *should* be monsters here, though. The adventurers can sense them. But the moment they get close, the presence of monsters simply vanishes. It always begins when they’re struck with the sense that something is about to attack them, but when they reach the place where the monster should be, they find nothing.

That means there’s something even more terrifying out there.

Something that even experienced A-Rank adventurers like them can’t detect.

It would be less mentally taxing if whatever is out there would just attack them already.

They’re all tightly wound, and the tension is wearing away at their nerves.

The eerie gazes are so terrifying that they can’t rest comfortably and have no choice but to keep walking.

They’ve never been on such an arduous journey before.

No matter how they search their memories, none of them can recall ever having a quest as difficult as this one.

“I’m sorry; I just can’t...”

The ranger’s companions soon join him on the ground one after the other.

“All right, then. We’ll set up camp here for the day. Let’s take a long break. I’ll take first watch. We’ll switch in two hours. Sleep as soon as you’ve finished your meals.”

Haah, everyone sighs deeply.

"I dunno. I was told they bought it in bulk from the Morgan Trading Co...."

"It's nutritious; I'll give it that. But everything else is...urgh..."

After washing down their nutritional yet nasty provisions with lukewarm water, the men sleep like logs.



"Arwf. (All right, let's head back out now that our bellies are full.)"

"Squea. (It has been one full day. They've probably traveled quite a distance already.)"

"Mrow. (Their mission will be complete soon enough, and then they can go home.)"

We meet in the garden again in the dead of night.

We polish off the light midnight snack that I brought, and Nahura teleports us with her magic.

My field of vision is filled with white light, and not even a second later, the scenery changes to the nighttime forest.

Yellow eyes are waiting for us.

“Grwl. (My king. I am glad to see you have returned safely.)”

It's the pitch-black Fen Wolf, Garo.

Her fur's so black, I can barely make her out in the dark forest.

For a moment, I think she's a ghost, and I almost scream, but that'll be our little secret.

“W-woof. (W-well, if it isn't Garo. I'm surprised you knew where we'd be.)”

“Grwl. (I followed your scent until it vanished here, so I knew we would meet again if I waited.)”

Of course. What amazing tracking skills wolves have.

But it's also stalker-ish and a little scary.

“Woof? (Where are the adventurers now? They must have traveled quite a ways without getting into any fights.)”

I immediately ask Garo for an update.

But her reply is less than ideal.

“Arwf?! (What?! No way, they've barely progressed at all?!)”

“Grwl. (Yes. I don't know why, but they were incredibly exhausted. They have set up camp much farther to the south from here. At this rate, it will be some time before they reach the waterfall.)”

So they haven't even passed this point yet.

“Woof. (Hmm, the forest is a cruel mistress. I honestly thought they'd breeze through it, since they're adventurers and all.)”

Could it be they're low-ranking adventurers?

We'll have to protect them even more now.

“Woof. (Well, I guess it works out better if they're slow. It'll take a while to get things ready. We three will continue to the waterfall. Garo, you and the others continue to guard them. And double your efforts.)”

“Grwl! (As you command, my king! Just leave it to us!)”

I watch Garo bolt upright when suddenly, something bugs me.

“Woof? (Hey, Garo? Have you gotten smaller?)”

I was sure Garo was larger than me.

But now she’s not.

“Grwl. (With all due respect, my king. I have not gotten smaller. It is you who has grown.)”

I understand what she’s saying.

“Woof. (Oh, right. It’s still only been two months since I was born. Of course I’d still be growing.)”

When I think about it, I do now have to squeeze my body through the back door, and the bed keeps creaking whenever I’m in it.

Looks like I’ve grown even bigger without realizing it.

Wait a minute. That’s a huge problem...

“G-grwl... (U-um, you’re not just bigger, but stronger, too! Much more magnificent...)”

Ugh, please don’t look all bashful while saying things like that.

It doesn’t make my heart flutter or anything. I’m *not* a furry.



“Captain...! The gazes have become more intense than yesterday...!”

“I—I think their numbers have also increased...!”

“F-foul beasts! Where are you?! Show yourself! Come out right now...!”

“What is this forest?!?!”

The more-intense gazes leave the adventurers in shock.

They begin to doubt they’ll reach their destination safely.

Fear and anxiety weigh down on them as the heroic A-Rank adventurers take another step deep into the forest.



“Snork...pheew...snork...pheew...”

The next morning, I'm asleep at the bottom of the stairs in the entranceway, my legs acting as a pillow, crossed under my head.

The cold marble floor feels fantastic on hot days.

When I sleep here, anyone who passes by gives me attention, so it's a pretty good spot.

"Arwf. (Up we get.)"

I manage to stand up, but my eyelids are so heavy, I can't seem to open them.

Ugh, I really shouldn't have done several all-nighters in a row...

When are the adventurers going to reach the waterfall? If they don't get there soon, they'll be wasting my hospitality.

I told Garo that the Fen Wolves needed to double their efforts. I wonder if I should have the whole pack follow the adventurers.

The image of the adventurers screaming "Please! Have mercy!" pops into the back of my mind, but it probably doesn't mean anything.

"Thanks, Routa. Don't push yourself, though. Let's read a book under the tree. I'll go get something to read and meet you there."

With that, Lady Mary runs up the stairs.

"Arwf! (Take your time, my lady!)"

"Squeak! (*Enough of this farce! Have some pride! Don't act so bashful over some human girl!*)"

"Arwf! (*Ah! Hey!*)"

"Arwf! (*I told you not to come out!*)"

"Squeak. (Hmm, I give you credit for your admirable behavior. I am the blue dragon Lenoworm.)"

All she can see is a mouse squeaking at her.

"It's a pleasure to meet you, cute little mouse."

"Squee. (H-hey. Don't pet my head.)"

Len protests as my lady tickles her head with her fingertips.

But it doesn't take long.

Len soon falls for Lady Mary's finger technique, melting on her belly until she resembles a soft rice cake.

"Right here? Does that feel good?"

"S-squee. (*Sh-shtaaap... D-don't touch meeee..... Or doooooooooo...*)"

I watch Lady Mary and Len enjoying themselves, and I internally bite on a handkerchief in frustration.

G-grrrrrrrrrr! N-not faaaaaaiiir!

First Nahura, and now even Len has stolen my lady's heart.

Damn it! Damn it!

The only one she should pet is me!

I'm going crazy with jealousy.

Come *ooooon*, Lady Mary! Pay attention to me, too! Look at me!

"Hee-hee. Okay, everyone, let's read."

She doesn't register my jealousy as she places Len on her shoulder and opens the hardcover book.

I figured it was just a hardback novel, but the inside looks like a nursery book with illustrations.

I wonder if she picked something simple because she is going to read to me.

My lady, you're far too kind. I want to serve you for the rest of my life.

"Once upon a time, the world was on the brink of ruin thanks to an evil Demon Lord. The Demon Lord was strong and trampled the weak like straw."

"Squeak. (*Hmph. How strong can one Demon Lord be? I'm sure I'm much stronger.*)"

"But despite the Demon Lord's fearsome strength, he had five attendees known as the Five Demon Generals."

The Five Demon Generals is a pretty nerdy name, but my lady continues.

The ruler of the dead who led evil spirits, Lich.

The demon-conquering ambassador of Hell, Belgor.

The demonic ruler of one hundred terrible beasts, Behemoth.

The pure-blooded immortal vampire princess, Carmila.

The commander of ancient giants, Gigas.

“These generals brought together the five species that decimated human lands one after another.”

“Squeak. *(Hmph, I don’t know of an era when the dragons were ruled over. Anyone who tried that would quickly find the tables turned on them.)*”

This spinster is trying to get one up on everything my lady is reading.

That’s really lame, Miss Spinster. You sound like some punk from the boonies, Miss Spinster. You’re past your prime, Miss Spinster.

“Then came a young man who stood for the people. He gathered the soldiers of fallen countries and met the Demon Lord’s army face-to-face.”

Her thin white fingers turn the page.

“His name was Routa. With his legendary sword, he defeated one of the Five Demon Generals, then another, and another.”

“Squeak. *(Oh, not bad. It doesn’t sound like he was a pervert, either, so he’s probably better than you, my darling.)*”

“Bark, bark! *(He was probably a pervert, too! I mean—I’m not a pervert! I’m a dog! I’m a dog; it’s only natural!)*”

There’s nothing weird about dogs licking and sniffing people.

If I were a human, I would be thrown in prison right away, right? But I’m a dog, so it’s fine.

Being a dog is great. I want to stay a dog and be fussed over and petted.

I want everyone to fuss over me and pet me as I eat too much and sleep a ton.

That’s right. I shall live the lazy life the brave man with my name would have wanted!

Looks like my lady’s reading is coming to a close as I argue with Len.

“And so, the hero Routa defeated the Demon Lord, saving the world and living happily ever after with the princess of his hometown.”

How clichéd.

Ptooie.

Popular guys are my natural enemy.

“Squee. (Are you not popular, my darling? At the very least, you have me, your beautiful princess, by your side.)”

“Woof, woof. (You’re a mouse, you know. And even if you transform, you’re still a dragon. You could at least try to look human.)”

“Squeak. (...Hee-hee, patience, my darling. I’ll grant that wish someday.)”

“W-woof? (Wh-what...?)”

Len huffs through her nose triumphantly but doesn’t explain further.

“Miss? Lunch is ready.”

The twin-tailed Toa arrives with news that lunch is ready.

Our eyes meet for a split second, but she immediately looks away.

Oh, right. You’re working. This puppy feels lonely now.

“Thank you, Toa. I’ll head right in.”

My lady closes her book, stands up, and straightens out her dress.

“Routa, little mouse. Let’s play again later once I’ve finished my lunch.”

“Woof! *(Okay! I’ll be waiting!)*”

“Squee! *(Very well. You are admirable, for a human. But I am my darling’s wife! Don’t you forget it!)*”

You’re not. Stop saying that.

My lady looks adorable as she waves her good-bye, and behind her, Toa gives a little wave, too.

As I watch them go, I’m overcome with a warm, fuzzy feeling.

Then Len bites me. It really hurts.



The happy scene occurring at the mansion far away means nothing to the adventurers whose minds and bodies are being pushed to the limit.

The four men sit in a circle around the small firepit, restlessly chewing on their provisions.

Though they are a good source of nutrition, nothing can erase the strong plantlike flavor weaved into the claylike texture.

These unpleasant rations—their only food—further chip away at their sanity.

Deep in the forest where no light reaches, they cannot tell if it is night or day.

Without even a single birdsong, the silence in the forest is unsettling.

They cannot even sense animals passing by.

And all around them, the eyes are watching, accompanied by the occasional menacing feel like one set of eyes is about to attack.

The shapeless creatures do not rest, and they watch the adventurers even now.

“.....This is hell.....”

It’s not clear who mumbles that.

No one replies.

What's the point in repeating the obvious?

There is no light in their eyes. Their cheeks are hollow. Their hair is disheveled, but there's no point in fixing it.

Their mental fatigue is impacting their bodies.

“.....”

The party says nothing as they extinguish the fire and collect their things.

They haven't slept. They're too afraid to sleep anymore.

How could the mysterious creatures watching them really wear them down this much?

The adventurers march onward, their legs dragging like they are full of lead.

They walk, just walk, like lost souls.



“Woof. *(Hmm, this is bad.)*”

I mumble as I look down at the scene below the hill.

Garo led me here to observe the adventurers dragging their feet as they walk.

They all look so hollow, it's as if all thoughts besides walking have vanished.

What terrible exhaustion.

This sparks a memory. I've felt that way before in the other world.

They have such a strong escort guarding them. Why are they this tired?

“Mrow... *(It's probably that...)*”

“Squeak. *(Hmm, I think so, too. It has to be.)*”

Len and Nahura nod in agreement.

“Woof. *(You two noticed it, too? I've been wondering if that was the problem.)*”

Our goal is to give the adventurers a safe journey.

But even though they already have such a great guard, they don't look happy at all.

It's like they're walking through hell.

There's only one reason they'd feel this way.

"Woof! Mrow! Squeak! (They need a bigger escort!)"

We say our conclusions aloud.

"Grwl! (So that was it!)"

Garo thought so, too? She seems relieved to hear it.

"Grwl. (I never expected the humans to be this weak. I shall gather every remaining Fen Wolf I can.)"

Garo directs Bal and the other wolves standing behind her. The Fen Wolves immediately split off into four directions to summon reinforcements.

"Woof. (Yes, good. The adventurers must have a safe journey.)"

"Meow. (Hee-hee, it feels nice to do a good deed.)"

"Squeak. (I feel like we may be spoiling them. However, I suppose we must if we are to protect our way of life at the mansion. We'll escort them to the ends of the earth.)"

We all nod in satisfaction.

"Grwl! (Just leave it to us, my king. In the name of the Fen Wolves, not even a single ant shall get through our defenses!)"

""""Grwl! Grwl! Grwl! (King! King! King!)""""

The Fen Wolves are riled up. Now I'm sure the adventurers will be able to reach their destination in peace.

"Woof! (All right! We're here!)"

We break out of the thicket, and the moonlight shines down on us.

We've finally arrived at our destination. We are able to exit the forest ahead of the adventurers.

Below us is a stream flowing through a wide riverbed.

It'll probably take the adventurers another two to three days to get here.

Plenty of time to prepare.

"Squee? (Darling, what in the world do you plan to do here? The remains of our battle are off in that direction.)"

Exactly as she says, the cave we fought in is a little farther north from here.

However, that's not where I want to execute my plan.

"Mewl. (Hmm. You mentioned you wanted to give the adventurers a treat, but you haven't yet told us what that treat is.)"

"Woof. (I'm going to prepare it right now. You're going to help, too.)"

I survey the area for a suitable location.

Somewhere close to the river but not too close. About twenty meters away should do. This place with a bunch of round stones polished by the river should be perfect.

"Woof... (Well, it's been a while, but...)"

I open my mouth a little and howl.

Magic coalesces in my mouth, and a narrow beam fires. I aim just in front of my feet, firing the beam of light straight down, piercing right through stone, dirt, and bedrock.

“Squee? (...What are you doing, my darling?)”

“Mewl? (Are you looking for earthworms to eat? They’re not very tasty, you know.)”

That’s not it.

I’m not going to eat anything.

Wait, Nahura’s tried earthworms?

“Woof? (All right, you see the mountains near here?)”

We look up over the waterfall and toward what people called the sacred mountains.

“Squeak! (D-don’t be ridiculous! I am a dragon. There is magic in this world that I can and cannot control. Extremely destructive magic is easy. But I am not proficient in regulation. It’s strange that you can fire it like that.)”

“Woof. (Oh, I get it. You’re a sore loser.)”

“Squeak! (I am not!)”

Just then, I hear a bubbling coming from the hole I just dug.

“Woof! (Oh, it’s here!)”

“Squea? (What’s here?)”

“Mewl? (That thing you called a hot spring?)”

Len and Nahura peek into the hole.

“Woof! (Ah, don’t, you idiots—!)”

The bubbling sound turns into a low rumble, and a second later, water bursts out of the hole.

“Squeeeeeeeee?! (Wh-whaaaaaaaaaat?!)”

“Meeeoowww?! (E-eeeeeeeeek?!)”

Len and Nahura are thrown into the air by the waterspout.

They’re not ordinary animals, so I’m not too worried about them, but I run over to the direction they’re thrown in, catching Len in my mouth and Nahura on my back.

“Mew... (Ahh...)”

“Squee... (I’m dizzy...)”

A moment later, spring water falls on us like rain.

“Woof! (That’s hot! —Or not...)”

It’s the perfect tepid temperature.

Just because it’s spring water doesn’t mean it’s going to be boiling hot.

This is great. I had anticipated the hot-spring water mixing with the river water to cool down, so this works out perfectly.

“Woof? (Nahura! Can you cover the hole with a large boulder for me?)”

“M-mewl. (S-sure. Just leave it to me.)”

I look around to see that Nahura has gotten up and buried herself beneath my belly.

She pops her face out from between my legs and floats a boulder buried in the river with her magic.

“Woof? (...Why are you between my legs?)”

“Mewl. (You’re a good rain shield. I absolutely hate getting wet.)”

Oh yeah, she hates baths, too.

I’ll have to force her into the hot spring when it’s done.

She’s starting to smell. Like a damp cloth.

“Mewl? (How’s that?)”

She rests the boulder on top of the hole, and the rush of warm water stops.

“Woof. (It’s great.)”

I wash the mud off my body in the garden’s fountain and shake the water off with all my might.

Then I slip back into bed with Lady Mary, looking completely innocent.

“Hmm.....Routa.....?”

“Arww. (*Yes, I’m here.*)”

Phew, that was a close one. But today was another successful “mission complete.”

My lady subconsciously hugs me, and I’m reminded of her softness as I soon fall asleep.



“Mmm, you’re so warm, Routa.”

She wraps her arms around my body, enjoying my coat.

“Arwf! (*Oh, Lady Mary! You’re so bold.*)”

“Mmm, so fluffy.”

Hee-hee, the fur around my cheek is particularly soft, right? You can pet me more if you’d like.

She buries her face into my white fur and breathes deep, drowning me in affection.

I would not lay a paw on such a beauty. But it doesn’t count if she’s the one who touches me.

"Squeak... *(I know you just want to play, but you always get so bashful around that girl.....)*"

Ever since Len experienced the petting prowess of Lady Mary, she's hidden herself deep in my fur and doesn't come out whenever my lady is around.

She said something about not wanting anyone to touch her except for her husband, even if it's another female.

"Woof? *(What's thiiiis? Len, are you jealous?)*"

"Squeak! *(Yes, I am! So pay attention! Pay attention to me more!)*"

"Woof! *(Wow! So honest! And ouch! That hurts!)*"

Stop biting me whenever you can't think of a comeback.

"Arwf. (Oh, right, I just remembered.)"

She tilts her head in confusion, not understanding what I'm trying to suggest.

She stares right at me lying prone.

I don't know if it's the way her maid clothes move at this angle, or if her skirt

is just short, but when I tilt my head at just the right angle, I can see right up—
No, that's bad!

Shut up, brain!

"Arww. (Come on, Toa. Climb up.)"

If you don't have a footstool, then you can use me instead!

"...Do you want me to get on?"

"Woof! (Yes! By Jove, I think she's got it!)"

"You want to help me? But..."

Nooo, no buts.

I paw at her.

"Fine... Thank you."

She giggles and takes off her shoes.

"Is that okay? I'm not too heavy, am I?"

"Arwf... (Oh-ho, this is quite...)"

The feeling of her soft stockings and light body seems to have awoken a new pleasure in me.

I feel like I'm starting to understand how Christina feels.

"Squee? (What an unsightly expression... Isn't this one even more of a child than the last female...?)"

That's not it. Don't say something so rude about Toa.

It's fine! I'm not doing anything wrong! Different worlds have different rules!

With me as her footstool, Toa gets the laundry on the line in no time.

"Thanks, Routa."

"Arwf. (No problem at all. Thank you.)"

I don't know if I should say *you're welcome* or *thank you*.

"I'm sorry for getting scared that time. You haven't changed at all from when you were a pup."

No, I'm sorry I scared you.

Now that I think about it, I *do* look scary. But I believe that if I can help out like this, then Toa'll think I'm cute like she used to.

She gives me a little wave, picks up the empty laundry basket, and heads back to the mansion.

"Yaaaaaaaawn... (One job, and I'm already exhausted...)"

Sooo sleepy. I should take a nap so I'm not tired tonight.

Tonight's the night we finish it!



"Woof, woof. (That's it, you need to lay the entire thing with stones. Slowly now. If you rush it, you'll kick up the settled dirt.)"

"Meow. (Okay, leave it to me.)"

Bathed in moonlight, Nahura gets to work with her levitation powers.

With a flick of her paw, stones from the river float up and one by one sink to the bottom of the spring.

The stones have been smoothed round by the river, making them a great floor to sit on when laid out correctly.

The once-warm water in the donut-shaped hole is now freezing, but it's also beautifully clear after being left alone for a day.

The stones cover the dirt carefully so as not to move the water too much.

Nahura's magic really is useful. We can do this without much labor or any heavy machinery.

"Mrow? (How does that look?)"

Stones of various sizes lie on one another so there are no gaps. The dirt shouldn't get kicked up into the water now.

She’s acting pretty haughty, but she never lifted a paw to help.

“Squea? *(It resembles the water fountain back at the mansion... What’s the point of it?)*”

“Arwf?! *(Huh?! You still don’t know?!)*”

You’ve gotta be kidding me.

“Mewl. *(I don’t know, either.)*”

Yeah, I guess it’s fine if you don’t understand. It would honestly make things harder if you did.

It’s best that you don’t know until you try it yourself.

“Grwl! (My king! I have a report!)”

Garo and a few other Fen Wolves come up to me just as we complete the hot spring.

“Grwl. (The adventurers will be here soon.)”

“Woof? (Ah, they finally made it?)”

“Grwl. (Not a single one of them has been harmed. We eliminated all monsters on the way.)”

“Woof. (Oh, nice work.)”

“Grwl! (I-it is an honor to be praised by you!)”

Garo and the other wolves are so moved they lie on their bellies and tremble.

They’re always so weird about proving their loyalty.

But since Garo and the other wolves don’t want to be equals, I’ll have to reward them for their efforts.

A job well done should be rewarded, after all.

I am just barely able to see my plan through to the end before the adventurers get here.

Thanks to the Fen Wolves’ thorough escort duties, the adventurers are able to have a relaxing trip.

But despite the lack of danger and injuries, walking all the time must still be tiring.

There’s where the hot spring comes in.

There’s nothing better than soaking your tired body in warm water, and eating delicious food should energize their bodies a hundred times over. Their long journey is over, and they can go home feeling refreshed and accomplished.

That’s why I made this plan, “Hot-Spring Vacation! Drip, Drop!”

Huh? What’s going *drip, drop*, you ask?

Well, that would be the adventurer’s— You know what? Never mind.

“Woof! (Nahura! Bring out the food we collected.)”

“Mewl! *(Okay!)*”

She activates her teleportation magic.

The basket with little bits of bread, ham, and cheese that I had snuck out of the kitchen at night falls out of her magic circle.

The poor adventurers, who have been eating nothing but those disgusting-looking rations, should have a feast with this.

They’re preserved foods, but old man James made them. Which means they’ll taste heavenly.

I’m sure they’ll be satisfied.

I place the basket next to the hot spring, and now everything is ready.

Now all that’s missing are the guests of honor.

“Woof! *(Okay, everyone, hide in the shadows and watch over them!)*”

The Fen Wolves disperse, hiding themselves in the shadow of a boulder or the long grass.

“Arwf, arwf? *(Are they here yet? Are they here yet?)*”

“Nom, nom. *(They won’t arrive immediately. Have some patience.)*”

“Nibble, nibble, nibble. *(Yes, that’s right. Haste makes waste, you know.)*”

“Woof! Woof?! *(Hey, what are you two eating?!)*”

They’re both holding food from the basket.

“Mrow. *(It’s just a taste. Just a taste.)*”

“Squee. *(That’s right. I need to check for poison. You should thank me.)*”

“Bark, bark! *(No fair! Let me have some!)*”

“Grwl... *(M-my king. Please be silent...)*”

I hear human footsteps coming from the forest as we argue like always.

“Woof! *(They’re here! Silence everyone. Munch, munch.)*”

“Squeak... *(You’re the loudest one here, darling. And I won’t forgive you for stealing my cheese...)*”

“Meow... (He took my sausage, too.....)”

I only took a little!

Don't act like I took everything!

I can slowly see the outline of humans coming from deep in the forest.

“Uwah...”

“Urgh...”

The four adventurers emerge from the forest looking absolutely ghastly.

They haven't been fighting, so their equipment isn't torn. Only their boots are covered in mud. But they still look like death.

Even zombies have healthier-looking faces than these guys.

I'm not entirely sure if they're conscious. They look worse than I did when I died of overwork with a zillion bags under my eyes.

“Squee? (Hey, why do they look so tired? All they did was walk, right?)”

“Mewl. (Yeah, maybe it's because they're such low-ranking adventurers.)”

“Squee. (Honestly, humans are so weak.)”

“Woof. (Oh well. It'll all be worth it once they start relaxing.)”

They should have learned along the way that the forest is completely safe.

Now they just have to relax in the hot spring and stuff themselves.

I hold my breath, waiting for the adventurers to see the treat before them.



“Uwah...”

“Urgh...”

The death march comes to an end as the adventurers break free of the deep forest. Before them lies the dried riverbed, bathed in moonlight.

Even though the moon is half-hidden by clouds, the pale light is almost blinding to their eyes, which have become used to the darkness.

Having been through the wringer, the weathered adventurers finally feel their

sanity returning.

“...Where is the destination point...?” the captain with the claymore asks the ranger.

“...Just a little farther. We should reach it by sunrise at this rate...,” spits the ranger, exhausted and with drool hanging from his mouth.

The instrument the guild loaned him is reacting very strongly. Their destination must be incredibly close.

The captain glances behind them.

The fatigued priest and steely lancer at the rear have become little more than groaning mannequins.

Their exhaustion is incredibly bad. They don't know what's going to happen at the investigation point, either.

It's too dangerous to go on like this.

“...We should rest here while we can. We're in no shape to conduct the investigation...”

The mysterious eyes that were following them until this point have gone away.

They should be able to rest for a little while now.

They have no idea what the creatures wanted with them. Maybe they were simply hoping to torment them? They never did get to see what the creatures looked like in the end.

“We don't need a lookout... There's no point... Just rest for as long as you like...”

If the creatures were going to kill them, they would have attacked them ages ago. And even if they were attacked, the group no longer has the stamina to fight back.

Recovering strength and energy is their top priority. Even if only a little, they need to be as refreshed as possible before moving on to conduct their investigation.

The whole party collapses by the riverbank. They throw down their things, sit on the ground, and let out sighs of exhaustion.

It's incredibly improper behavior for A-Rank adventurers, but there's no one around to point that out.

"Captain... What do you suppose that is...?"

The first one to notice the anomaly is the ranger.

Steam can be seen rising just a short distance from them.

"What is that...?"

It's hard to get back up again after they just caught a break, but they have to check it out.

The captain heads over to the steam with the rest of the party following behind.

"What in the world...?"

It's a circular stream. It looks man-made. There's no way something like this occurred naturally.

The ranger takes off his glove and dips his hand into the water.

"It's warm. There's also a faint smell of sulfur. It's a hot spring."

"Out here?"

In the middle of the hot spring is a giant boulder, with plenty of warm water flowing out of the central hole.

He's seen a lot of naturally forming hot springs before. But someone clearly made this one.

"Do you think anyone lives near here?"

"Impossible. I heard this forest is unexplored. The reason we're even here is because no one lives near where that magical disaster occurred."

"Then what *is* this?"

"If you think about it, maybe the things that were watching us this whole time made it?"

“Then our situation really is hopeless...”

This completely changes what they thought about their stalkers simply being strong monsters.

The carefully placed stones. The boulder carved to provide hot water. Now that they look closer, there’s even a waterway dug out to the river to let out cooled water.

This means there are creatures intelligent enough to make something like this deep in the forest.

It wouldn’t just be hopeless, but the worst of the worst situations imaginable.

“C-Captain. Do you see that...?”

The lancer is pointing at a willow basket. It’s full of bread and cheese and other food.

“““Gulp...”””

All of them gulp.

For the past few days, they’ve had nothing to eat but claylike provisions, making this simple basket look like a banquet.

“I’m not hallucinating, right...?”

“Ha-ha-ha-ha... A hot spring and banquet in middle of the forest? What kind of sick joke is this?”

The ranger grasps his cheeks and lets out a dry laugh.

Even if it’s an illusion, they’ve stopped caring. They’re past understanding at this point.

The ranger’s laugh, which is closer to a sob by now, echoes into the forest.

He suddenly stops.

“...Nobody. Move,” he warns.

The others look over to where the ranger is staring.

It’s the unchanging forest thicket.

What could have gotten the ranger so worked up?

Just then, the clouds that were covering the moon shift.

There, reflected in the moonlight, are countless eyes.

“EEK...!”

How long have they been hiding there?!

Sure, they’re tired, but even from this distance, they didn’t sense anything.

Now they understand the strength of the creatures hidden in the woods.

They suddenly have the ominous feeling that a dragon, or some other legendary beast, is staring at them.

Ordinary adventurers wouldn’t have noticed them.

But the guild’s best high-class adventurers can tell the difference in their power.

They cannot win against whatever’s in the brush.

The countless eyes hold no malice. But they are unsettling enough.

“...What is going on...?”

The captain has to swallow his fear to think.

Let’s review the details.

Eyes watching them from the forest and the occasional flash of murderous intent. A hot-spring bath for cleaning the body. And a basket full of food.

What is the meaning behind all this?

“...Oh. I see now...”

The captain comes to a single conclusion.

“I get it. I have it now, you shapeless monsters. I know what you’re after now.”

He glares at the forest as he grits his teeth.

“We’re your meal.”

They prepare their meals by observing their prey, driving them to the edges of fear and exhaustion.

He's heard of vampires, intelligent monsters that improve the taste of their victim's blood by instilling them with fear.

The endless observation and hostile aura are all for the purpose of leading them here to be feasted upon.

And the final phase of the plan is to have the adventurers clean themselves in the hot spring and fatten themselves up with the food.

In response to the captain's conclusion, countless eyes seem to blaze in the darkness.

"Their meal...? Did you say we're their meal...?"

"Damn it all... We were playing right into their hands the whole time..."

Their bodies are frozen with fear.

Even if they head back now, it's too late. There's no way they would be able to return alive now that they know the truth.

The eyes in the thicket are just waiting for them to be done.

To go on is death. To turn back is death. The adventurers shout.

"Who... Who would happily go along with your plan?!"

"Do you think we're going to just let you eat us...?!"

"We're proud adventurers, the Swords of Dawn! Not some pigs to be eaten!"

"Let's go, men! We must complete this investigation no matter what. We'll go to the magic disaster point and report our findings to the guild! Even if only one of us survives, we shall emerge victorious!"

""""Yeah!""""

The adventurers, now fueled by rage, ignore the hot spring and food and run north for the waterfall.



"""" """"

Whaaaaaaaaaaaaat?!

The adventurers suddenly become enraged and run off.

“Arwf?! (The hot spring! The feast! Aren’t you going in?! Aren’t you going to eat something?!)”

I don’t get it! What was wrong with the gift I put *all* my effort into?!

If it were me, I’d be over the moon to get in a bath and eat some good food. But it doesn’t seem to appeal to the adventurers at all.

“Squee? (More importantly, beloved, they’re heading straight for the waterfall. Should we just leave them to it?)”

“Arwf? (Huh? The waterfall...? What about it...?)”

I’m so shocked at my gift being ignored that I can’t think about anything else.

What’s wrong with them going there?

“Mrow. (You know. The plan was to show them that there are no dangers in the forest while also slowing them down so that we could disperse the magic around the waterfall. Remember?)”

“.....Arwf. (.....Ah.)”

“Squeak? (.....Don’t tell me you forgot. What did you think we were going to do after this?)”

“A-arwf. (H-ha-ha-ha, whoops... Yeah, I completely forgot.)”

“Mew... (Routa...)”

“Woof! (S-stop it! Don’t look at me like that!)”

I look away from Nahura’s judgmental stare.

“Squeak. (Oh dear. So you’re the type who turns the means into the goal and forgets about the future.)”

Grrr. You’re really enjoying this, aren’t you?

But I have no comeback. Our main objective completely left my mind halfway through making the hot spring.

“Bark! (N-no, we still have time!)”

The treat failed, but we can still recover from this.

We just have to get to the waterfall before them and disperse the magic.

“Woof! (Let’s go! We’re going to get there before the adventurers!)”

“Grwl! (Yes, sir! Leave the escort to us! You head there right away, my king!)”

With a low growl, the Fen Wolves disperse.

Nahura and Len get on my back, and I run as fast as I can.

“Squee? (By the way, darling, how do you plan on dispersing the magic?)”

Len’s question forces us to realize one crucial detail.

“Woof? (Huh? Don’t you two know?)”

“Mew. (I don’t.)”

“Squeak. (Neither do I. I know how to use the magic within myself, but I have no idea how to disperse magic I’ve already released.)”

What?!

Shouldn’t that be your field of expertise as fantasy creatures?!

Just do some kind of *pow, pow, poof*, and it’s gone, right?!

“Squeak. (Weak humans have probably thought about how to use magic in the atmosphere. But dragons with an abundance of magic have no need for such things. We don’t learn what we don’t need to learn. That’s just common sense, isn’t it?)”

“Woof! Woof! (Don’t act so high and mighty! What good is a thousand-year-old spinster?! A dragon who knows nothing is useless!)”

“Squeak! (Wh-what did you say?!)”

“Woof! Woof! (Which reminds me! You were completely useless this time, too! All you did was act arrogant and hang out on my head!)”

“Meow! (Oh, I helped out!)”

“Woof! (Yes you did! You’re a good girl! Garo and others are good wolves! But, Len, you’re a bad girl!)”

A very bad girl! I won’t forgive anyone who’s an even bigger freeloader than I am!

“S-squeak! (Wh-what?! If you’re going to go that far, then just you wait! I’m

going to show you how useful I can be!!)”

And with that, Len flies into the air.

With a flash of light, a giant blue dragon appears.

“GROOOOOAR!! (I just need to get there faster than them, right? When I put my mind to it, I can fly faster than the speed of sound!)”

She grabs Nahura and me in her thick front claws.

“Bark! (Hey! Wait! What if the adventurers see you?!)”

Making them believe no monsters live here is a key part of the plan!

“GROOOOOAR! (It’s fine! You males shouldn’t split hairs! I just have to fly fast enough that they don’t see me! Let us be off!!)”

“Arwf! (It’s not fine! This isn’t good at all! If you fly faster than the speed of sound, then you’ll have to break the sound barri—)”

We’re suddenly struck with incredible speeds before I can finish.

Or so I think, but it doesn’t happen.

I look down to the dark forest to see it whizzing past, but I don’t feel the wind at all.

“GRRRAR! (Who do you think I am?! I put up a shield before breakfast! At this speed, the darkness will also keep us hidden from the adventurers.)”

“Mew...? (Um, about the adventurers...you know when we just flew up into the air...?)”

I look down to see that the adventurers, smaller than grains of rice, have fallen over on the riverbank.

They remind me of people I’ve seen get knocked over by typhoon winds.

Ohhh, they’re gonna be all beat up... Yikes...

“.....GROOOOOAR! (.....Perfect! That will buy us some more time!)”

“Woof... (This is terrible. They’re definitely going to think there’s something wrong with this forest...)”

Even if we get ahead of them, we have no way to disperse the magic. There’s

no way to fix this.

Checkmate. Total checkmate.

The adventurers are going to report everything to the guild. Then the real investigation will begin.

If loads of adventurers come, they'll find Garo and the other Fen Wolves and spread the word that this forest isn't safe.

And if loads of adventurers show up, at least one of them is bound to uncover my true identity.

Even the clueless people at the mansion will be swayed if a crowd of people explain it to them.

It's over! My pet life is over!

I hang limp in Len's claws as I lose all hope and the energy drains from my body.

Flying at that speed, it's barely a moment before Len arrives at the waterfall.

She beats her wings a few times to slow down, and we have a smooth landing.

"GRAR? (Darling, we're here... Hey, what's the matter, darling?)"

"Arww... (Oh, you know. Just the realization that pet life as I know it is over, and there's no point in trying anymore...)"

"GROOOAR? (Hmph. What if we explain everything to them? I don't know much about these humans, but maybe they'll understand if you talk to them. Or shall I have a word with them?)"

"Bark... (Don't you remember what happened with Zenobia...? She attacked you before trying to talk to you...)"

I lie down, drained of energy.

"GRRAR? (Would you prefer we simply wait for something to be born of all the magic gathered here? A monster born of our magic would be a very powerful child. Then we can live a long life together as a family... Oh, that actually sounds like a great plan!)"

“Woof! Woof! (No it does not! How is it a solution to give the guild more monsters to hunt down?! Actually, can you please stop trying to force a kid on me?!)”

What kind of messed up life plan ends with my being stuck with the responsibility of fatherhood as a two-month-old puppy?

“Arwf... (Haah, it’s no use...)”

I won’t be able to live at the mansion anymore once the cat’s out of the bag.

Even if my lady and the others try to protect me, the guild will probably send adventurers to kill me.

Not low-level adventurers like this time, or hack adventurers like Zenobia, but a lot of really strong ones.

I’ll have to leave the mansion before it becomes a battleground.

But then where will I go? A weak, city-spoiled child like me can’t survive in the wilderness.

I’m scared of hunting, and I don’t want to eat raw meat. Especially now that I’ve tasted old man James’s cooking. Nothing else can even be considered food!

My life, my perfect doggy life, is over... All that awaits me is death by starvation...

Lady Mary, it looks like this is the end for your Routa.

Please be well...

“Mrow? (Routa? Routa?)”

Nahura pokes my nose with her long tail.

“...Woof. (...What? I’m about to read my last will and testament. Don’t get in the way.)”

“Mew! (It looks like everything is okay now!)”

“Arwf? (Huh?)”

I get up and look over to where Nahura is pointing.

“Oh my, you guys sure are late.”

Over by the half-destroyed pool near the waterfall stands a witch with a silver staff.

She has silver hair, a wide-brimmed tricornered hat, long ears, and a voluptuous body.

She's a witch I know very well.

"Woof?! (H-Hecate?! What are you doing here...?!)"

I don't know if she's using her levitation magic or something, but she's standing on top of the water.

"Let's talk later. I've just finished the spell."

What spell?

As soon as she says that, she stabs her staff into the water. A giant, glowing magic circle causes the water to rise up with the staff in the center. It changes itself into complicated shapes as it expands all the way out to us.

"GRRAR...?! (Wh-what is this magic circle...?! I've never seen such a complicated spell before! I cannot decipher its purpose at all...!)"

Looks like this magic confuses Len, even though she's lived for so long.

The giant magical circle becomes three-dimensional, and the light gets more intense.

"Woof?! (Is it okay for us to be here?! Isn't this bad?!)"

"Mew. (Well, Mistress didn't say anything, so I suppose it's okay. She probably would have sent us off somewhere if we were in the way.)"

Nahura, who knows Hecate the best, lazily plops down.

Hecate lets go of the staff stuck in the water and begins to chant in a way that sounds like she's singing.

As if in response to her chant, the shining magic circle covers the whole pool, and its pattern gets even more complicated.

"...Hmm, it might not be quite enough. Routa, over here, please."

"W-woof! (Whoa, hey! What are you doing?!)"



Hecate waves me over in the middle of her chant, and my body starts floating in the air. I float all the way over until I'm next to her.

"I was wondering if you might be able to add a little magic to my circle. It requires a bit more than I had expected."

"Woof! Woof?! *(We came here to get rid of the magic, but aren't you just adding to it?! Wait, what are you doing here in the first place?!)*"

"Now is not the time for explanations. But what if I told you that if you help me here, then all your problems up until now will be solved?"

"Woof! *(Seriously?! Then of course I'll help you!)*"

I don't know what she's going to do, but I'll do anything to protect my pet life!

"Thank you. If you could just hurl magic as hard as you can straight up, that would be great."

All right! Leave it to me. I just need to fire a beam straight up, right?

I'll just pack all my feelings into it, and here comes my vom-beam.

"Awooooooooooooo?! *(Hey, adventurers, why didn't you want to get in my hot spriiiiiiiiiiiiiing?!)*"

My howl of sorrow becomes a pillar of light, piercing right through the middle of the magic circle dome.

Or rather, the pillar of light crashes into the dome and splits off into six parts, which then diffuse down the walls of the dome, causing the circle to shine even brighter.

Like cogs in a machine, the complicated patterns of the magic circle begin to move faster, the light shining so bright it almost looks like daylight.

The white light illuminates all around me, and I'm forced to shut my eyes.

Just beyond my limited vision, I hear a *click* sound, as if a door just opened.

"That's one down," I hear Hecate murmur next to me, but her words are cryptic and strange.

"It's over. Good work, Routa."

I blink a few times as I open my eyes to see Hecate floating above the water.

The blinding magical circle that was just here has now completely vanished without a trace.

All that surrounds me is the glow of the moon and the sound of the waterfall.

“Arwf...? *(What was that...?)*”

I can hear Hecate giggling as I pore over this.

“Hee-hee, it’s a secret for now. But I know that someday it’ll be something you’ll find useful, Routa.”

“Arwf...? *(Me...?)*”

I guess that magic circle really did take a lot out of her.

“Arwf. *(Hmm, well, all right.)*”

I’ll have no idea, even if I try to figure it out.

A pet dog doesn’t need to know anything about magic. It’s best to let sleeping thoughts lie.

“Woof! Woof! (At least now all the residual magic is gone, right? Thanks, Hecate! I’m sure everything will be fine now!)”
