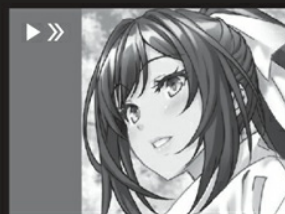
## Kousuke Takioto

The best friend character from *Magical★Explorer*. The soul of a Japanese eroge aficionado dwells within him. Possesses a unique ability.



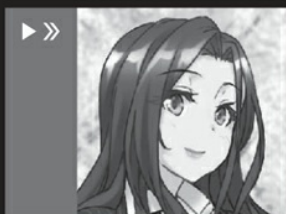
## Ludie

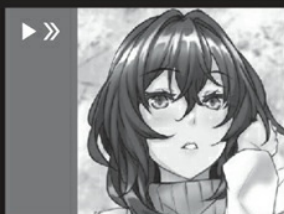
## Yukine Mizumori

Principal of Tsukuyomi Magic Academy, the game's main setting. Receives limited screen time in the game, so she's shrouded in mystery.



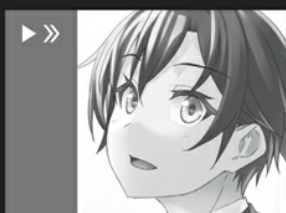
## Hatsumi Hanamura

Marino Hanamura's daughter and Kousuke's second cousin. Generally very quiet and reserved. Teaches at Tsukuyomi Magic Academy.



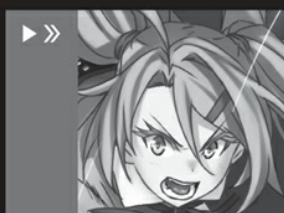
## Claris

Elf who serves as Ludie's bodyguard and maid. Serious and devoted to her mistress, she has a tendency to beat herself up over her failures.



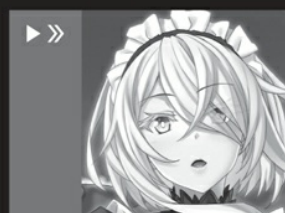
## Iori Hijiri

A maid created to assist Dungeon Masters. Belongs to the angel race, who are few in number.

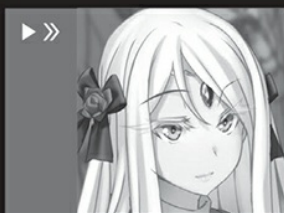




## Monica

Iori receives a brazen invitation from Takioto to “check out a sex shop,” and the two hit up a certain store. Of course, it’s possible to turn down his offer, but any eroge player is sure to leap at the opportunity, no questions asked.

There, you happen to bump into Ms. Ruija on her first day of work. By the way, Takioto gets kicked out for being rude to another employee, so he doesn’t even get to meet her. Truly A+ eroge best friend character behavior.

“I do.....”

In-game, Ms. Ruija is strapped for cash and takes up the job in the sex shop part-time. The exact details of her money problems are never made clear to the player, but if the protagonist gives her a huge chunk of change, an amount you won’t see until the end of your first playthrough, this starts to resolve the situation. Though at the same time, this puts Ms. Ruija at the protagonist’s beck and call, since he can leverage her financial difficulties against her. Now that I thought about it, solving everything with money was quite the power play.

If Ms. Ruija had been more popular with players, the developers might have expanded her storyline in a patch and revealed the source of her duress. Unfortunately, however, she didn’t have too many admirers. Though I really liked her, especially because I was a fan of the actress who voiced her. Maybe fans weren’t happy the character was so close to thirty?

“Is there really a dungeon in this place? And forgive my asking, but did you actually find written materials claiming that was the case? There isn’t a ‘Du’ symbol—the mark that indicates the presence of a dungeon—on the map, either.”

Nanami had an excessively suspicious look in her eyes.

“I’m telling you, that’s what I saw. The document said it’s actually a dungeon.”

That was what I told her, but of course, I hadn’t actually seen anything like that. I’d made up a random lie on the spot as cover, so it wasn’t surprising that she was skeptical. The documents outlining the dungeon do actually exist, though. You have to trade in a number of magic stones at a used bookstore somewhere to get them. But this was just a conversation event in-game, so I hadn’t been able to go off the visuals to find the shop in this world.

I’d wondered if Iori had gotten his hands on it and had messaged him about it, but alas, it appeared he hadn’t found the used bookstore, either. That place also sold information about dungeons the developers added in later content

updates as well, so I very much wanted him to find it and learn where everything was. Even without those materials, however, I could manage to locate the dungeons myself by comparing my memory of the game with my map, so at least I wasn't completely stuck.

I intensified the mana flowing through my stole and went into the hole.

It was just wide enough to fit a line of four people across. Nanami and I both used Light as we advanced deeper and deeper inside. Then, after we'd headed about 250 feet in, we came to an open space.

I could understand why Nanami would interpret things this way. Anyone who wrote this place off as nothing more than ruins would have the same misunderstanding.



Even in a normal game, if a player heard “Thou must offer three of the final shields that protect a warrior maiden’s body,” they’d probably imagine armor forged by a goddess or the shield of a hero. And if this were the real world, all the more so.

But for an eroge like *Magical ★Explorer*, that interpretation didn’t cut it.

“Ummm, welp. I really don’t want to say this, but... According to the document I read... The shield protecting a body means clothing... Makes sense, right? So by ‘final’ they mean...”

“.....”

Nanami sent a scowl in my direction, appearing to surmise what I was getting at. I couldn’t help feeling an urge to flee. Still, I had to say it.

“Um, it’s, well...a woman’s...y’know. The last piece of clothing you take off when undressing, that’s what we need to offer here... Of course, I didn’t think this up, no ma’am. I would never think up anything like this, not me. The document said to do this. That by offering three pairs of panties—used pairs, mind you... We can move forward.”

A frigid mood descended on the area.

Nanami was expressionless. Her blank visage only compounded the disgust and anger she was sending my way, and I was just about ready to piss myself in terror. She wasn’t even blinking; she just kept her unending stare locked on me.

Oh, I got it. She wasn’t directing her glare at *me*. She was glaring at the dungeon, right? A nebulous feeling of guilt welled up inside me when I considered that a fellow eroge enjoyer had created this mechanism.

“No, wait, you’ve got it all wrong. You gotta believe me!”

Actually, nothing was incorrect. If anything, I’d have gladly wished for such an offering myself under different circumstances. It wasn’t even my fault things were like this, really, yet for some reason, I was racked with a strange sense of

shame. Pressured by this feeling, I soon found myself prostrated on the ground, begging Nanami's forgiveness.

I knew this was how things would go no matter who I came with, which is why I hadn't even wanted to clear this dungeon in real life!

When I'd first discovered how to unlock the dungeon while playing the game, I was so moved by the sinfulness, the profundity, the practicality of it all that I couldn't help but bow my head in admiration.

A heroine would immediately reject any request for her underwear. Though now that I thought about it, I couldn't say that definitively for every eroge heroine. In some cases, they weren't wearing any to begin with! Typically, though, they'd refuse outright. That's why concocting a scenario in which the only way forward was forcing the heroines to hand over their panties was absolutely supreme eroge design. My first playthrough, I'd immediately brought my favorite party members to plunge into this dungeon. I mean, who wouldn't?

Then, when the words "Who's panties will you offer?" and a selection of the heroines in your party showed up on the screen, how was anyone supposed to stop their mouse hand from trembling with anticipation?

Depending on which heroine the player chooses, they are treated to an icy cold glare and rewarded with titillating insults of "idiot," "pervert," and the like. Then she gives the player a warning: "If nothing ends up happening, you know what's coming, right?" Once they offer up the panties, freshly removed in a fit of indignant embarrassment, the game really does advance forward. It sure does work like a charm, yessiree. It skips right to the next screen.

Oh, how many times had I reloaded my save to see each character's dialogue...?!

That wasn't all, either; the game slips in special exchanges based on which characters you bring to the dungeon with you. With the help of the gentlemen tasked with editing the game wiki, I'd tried out every pattern possible. It was truly a riveting moment of the game.

Even more surprising was that with heroines added in later patches, the game not only shows them taking off their panties for this scene, but also gives them brand-new dialogue patterns for the player to enjoy.

I'd thought it was masterful.

Mooooooooore like disasterful.

Whoever thought this up was a hopeless buffoon. How the hell are you supposed to go up to a woman and ask her to give you her used panties? Who could even ask that—are you insane? Sure, you could forgive this idiotic little scenario in an eroge, but in real life, it was nothing but god-awful, batshit-crazy design. The guy who thought this up must have had his brain scrambled with smut. If they needed to offer something to the dungeon, there were plenty of more sensible options! Swords, gems, anything! I want to be there for you, too. If something comes up, I want you to come to me about it. Like you did this time.”

She averted her gaze.

“Still, this truly is embarrassing... But if it’s to help you out, Kousuke... I’d give you as many of my panties as you need.”

Once Ludie finished saying her piece, she hung her head, as though embarrassed that what she’d just said had actually come out of her mouth. A moment later, she turned her back from me.

I was so very, very happy. Honestly, I figured Ludie was going to hurl insults at me. Though we were relatively close with each other, I would have had no room to complain if she’d slammed a letter denouncing our friendship right in my face the moment I asked her to fork over her panties.

"Drat, and I had planned on ultimately squishing your face into my chest so I could pat your head and console you afterward, too. What a shame."

What an attractive proposition. If I pretended to get hit with some mental strain right now, would she still do that for me? Hold on, that was all under the premise that my cross-dressing would end up failing, though.

"With that in mind, here..."

She held something out for me. It was a piece of fabric with light blue and white stripes.

Nanami wouldn't be the type to pass me a handkerchief in a moment like this. It didn't even look like a handkerchief in the first place, what with the adorable little ribbon on it. No, it took me all of a second to figure out what this item was.

This pair’s daring and aggressive edge made my heart skip a beat.

Sis’s panties, which had been etched into my memory moments prior, didn’t open up at all. They’d been unreservedly spread wide open right from the start.

Just then, I realized that there were eyes on me.

Ludie and Yukine were staring, begging me to look away.

I felt like I was going to cough up blood...

Moving like a machine that hadn’t been oiled in a century, I used both hands

to laboriously turn my face away from my view of paradise. Then, heart weeping in my chest, I etched the sight of these three treasures into the depths of my memory.

It was about a minute later when Nanami gave me permission to lift my head back up.

When I opened my eyes, I was greeted with serious expressions from Nanami, Ludie, and Yukine, a complete departure from how they'd looked moments before. Meanwhile, Sis seemed the same as ever.

A magic circle had appeared in the middle of the three pedestals.

I took a deep breath and filled my stole with mana before making two, then three practice swings. Yukine produced her naginata, Ludie and Sis their staffs, Nanami her bow and short sword, and they each began to prepare themselves for combat.

I, too, retrieved my katana from my bag. After confirming with everyone that they were ready to go, I took a step inside the circle.

When hearing the word *dungeon*, I imagine the first word that comes to mind for most people is *traps*.

A great many players of roguelikes or other similar games, myself included, have probably enjoyed several lifetimes' worth of these devices' painful blessings before.

Literally, several lives' worth.

Landmines exploding at your feet, switches that release monsters, pitfalls that bottom out into the nest of a creature.

Now, this is merely my personal impression, but it seems that the most unfair ways to die in these games usually involved traps. I absolutely hated when I'd be tearing my way through a dungeon, only to have a trap immediately push me to the brink of death. I truly, truly *loathed* them.

Up until I was in high school.



In the world of eroge and other pretty girl-focused games—recently with manga and anime as well—these sorts of traps are at their best. The great thing about them is that they revolve around snagging the heroines in some dubious liquid or tentacle-like appendages, or forcing them into lewd poses, or in extreme cases, hiding enemies in a pitfall who have attacks that will only dissolve a character’s clothing—situations that make it impossible to keep a level head.

*Magical ★ Explorer* is no exception. Like any other eroge, when the characters are caught in a trap, your dungeon crawl will immediately grind to a halt to show you a CG of the event. That way, you can admire the scene and sear it into your brain.

But unfortunately, this was real life. I couldn’t do anything like that. Though, when I’d rescued Ludie, such a trap provided me with a lovely opportunity.

Now, the latest dungeon we’d at last gained access to, the Gloomy Ruins, is filled with traps. You can’t clear this dungeon without installing a retailer-exclusive bonus patch, and it isn’t exactly required to build the strongest possible character, so there are likely many gentlemen who skip it entirely.

Nevertheless, there are several items hidden in its depths that make clearing other dungeons down the line much easier in a first-time playthrough. One of them I wanted to get my hands on so badly that I had come here fully prepared to be looked at like a pervert to get it. That was why...

“I need to snag that item at all costs...”

I gave a small sigh as I punched the wrappings off a mummy with my Third Hand. The mummy fell to the ground, and its body gradually dissipated into magic particles and a magic stone.

Now, what sort of monster is a mummy exactly? They are corpses, dried out like beef jerky and wrapped up in bandages from head to toe, save for a portion of their face. These sorts of undead, which wouldn’t be out of place in an Egyptian pyramid, are often used as a monster in other fantasy games.

The first word that came to mind as I looked at them was *disgusting*. The mummy’s face, slightly blackened and lacking any vitality, takes a mental toll on you.

Fighting these undead-type monsters in later dungeons was going to be annoying. Since the mummies were all dried out, they didn't smell too bad. But zombies are a different story. Their rotten bodies reek so intensely that even the game characters comment about the stench being unbearable. Honestly, I didn't want to fight them at all. They show up in a required dungeon down the line, though, so it was all but guaranteed I'd end up seeing them.

We were only fighting humanoid mummies at the moment, but later on in this dungeon, and in later dungeons, animal-shaped mummies would appear, too. Goat mummies, gazelle mummies, lion mummies, and more. Fortunately, none of the monsters that showed up in this dungeon were very strong, so I didn't need to worry about them too much.

As I picked up the magic stone, Nanami came over to me.

"That was a wonderful battle, Master."

"Nah, couldn't have done it without you backing me up. Find Traps is saving our hides, too."

Nanami's backline support with her bow was actually helping me out a lot, and sometimes she would defeat an enemy before I could get in melee range.

"I am simply glad what little power I have is proving beneficial. That said, I do not have much confidence in my Find Traps skill, so I caution against relying on it too heavily..." Nanami said, looking apologetic. But based on her performance in the game, her detection rate was out of this world.

In *Magical ★Explorer*, skills that detect traps have levels; the higher the level, the easier it is to discover them.

While Nanami can raise her Find Traps level easily, it starts at level zero. Meanwhile, Katarina naturally has a certain number of levels in her detection skills because her main class has thief skills. Additionally, she has relatively high levels in both Disarm Trap, which is used to negate traps on treasure chests, and Unlock, which you can use to pick the locks on treasure chests.

Initially, I'd estimated that Nanami had an 80 to 90 percent chance of detecting traps. But thus far, she'd boasted a 100 percent detection rate on up to the third layer of the dungeon, so it was possible that the Maid-Knight

Servant Heaven Form was equipped with another ability of some kind. Though, there was always the chance that she had actually missed some, and we'd just been lucky enough to avoid stepping on them.

Now, while avoiding these devices was a good thing, it was also devastatingly disappointing.

We weren't getting caught in anything.

I was missing the chance of seeing Ludie or Yukine forced into an erotic situation and explaining it all away with a helpless Find Traps slipup.

If they were going to get ensnared in a trap, I would've preferred it happen in one here in the Gloomy Ruins, since they didn't cause any physical harm.

Alas, it seemed that, too, would never come to pass. Given that Nanami had already detected a lot of traps at this point, her skill level had to be going up with it. The dungeon was filled with nothing but low-grade traps, so it was fair to say it was designed to serve as an introduction to that mechanic.

It seemed the fighting on the opposite end had also wrapped up. Ludie and Yukine came over to us.

"Feels like overkill with us all here."

Yukine smiled ironically as she spoke.

She was spot-on. The monsters in here didn't even hold up to what appeared on the twelfth layer of the Tsukuyomi Magic Academy Dungeon. As was often the case with pre-order bonus or limited-edition bonus content, this place was a low-level dungeon that players could clear on their first playthrough. For Yukine, who had likely cleared down to the fiftieth layer of the Tsukuyomi Dungeon, or Sis, who had graduated and fully cleared sixty layers, the monsters here were probably putting them to sleep.

In fact, Yukine and Sis were intentionally hanging back and holding off from fighting to help Ludie, Nanami, and me gain experience. But even with a party of three, nothing up until now had put us in danger.

"Not another forked path...", Ludie grumbled, looking fed up as she came near.

There were two paths before us. We had already reached several dead ends by this point, and Ludie seemed a little tired. It would be a good idea to take a break once we got to the next layer.

“Which way shall we go?”

I had no way of answering Nanami’s question. The layout of this dungeon changed every time you entered, so I was clueless.

“Doesn’t matter either way, really... Let’s go right, then.” Nobody else showed any indication of preferring one way over the other, so I simply picked a path at random to go down. It became clear shortly after starting down the path that I had made the correct choice. In front of us were the stairs leading down to the lower layer.

*“Hngh... Haah, haah...,”* Ludie panted after I stopped sending her my mana. Then she leaned up against me as she got her breathing under control. Tsukuyomi Academy Dungeon opened the day exams started—today. The written exams took four days, and the practical exams took one, so the testing period was five days in total. Personally, however, those items and points were practically table scraps compared to one of the other rewards.

The second benefit was admission into one of the Three Committees (the Student Council, Morals Committee, or Ceremonial Committee). Taking the top score on these first exams was your quickest route to Committee membership. When that happens in the game, they approach the player about joining... They'd come talk to me about it in this world, too, right? Right?

Joining the Three Committees was extremely important. On top of making progress with various different events, I'd get the ability to go and challenge a certain dungeon. Most important of all, I'd have chances to interact with the other members of each Committee. That being said, most of the events were way down the line, and I planned on having Iori handle most of them. But if he ended up having a rough time, I was also willing to help him out... And if he *asked* me to, well, um... I—I guess I would want to lend him a hand. Maybe.

However, even admission into the Three Committees paled in comparison to the special bonus for clearing these layers on your first visit.

And what else could it be but a high-rarity item? After all, it wasn't first-time players, but those on their second playthrough who set their sights on it.

Sending a nearby carplin flying with a punch, I continued on through the maze without looking back to confirm if it was dead.

The finish line for the second layer was already in front of me. I only ever visited this level once per playthrough, so my memory of it had been foggy. To my surprise, however, I managed to get through it just fine.

"Already at the next level? I'm making good time."

Since I'd set everything up with Marino ahead of time, no one had tried to stop me when I came to challenge the Tsukuyomi Academy Dungeon. As of this moment, the map was exactly how I remembered it. Smooth sailing.

"The next thing to worry about...is this upcoming layer."

Maps were one of the variables that could cause me to fail to get through the forty floors. If the layouts were exactly how I remembered them, I could go from layer to layer via the shortest possible routes and drastically reduce my

clear time. Conversely, if the maps differed even slightly from their in-game counterparts, or I forgot any of them, I'd need to be prepared to spend extra time running around the dungeon, lost.

Currently, everything in the dungeon was as I remembered. But the magic circle taking me to the next floor—which I had just entered—would determine whether that held true.

When I stepped out of the device, I found myself in a room constructed from brick, resembling the previous layer. I immediately broke into a run and continued through the wide hallways, big enough to fit seven to eight people across.

Then, I found the thing I was looking for.

“Awwwwwwyeah! Oh, yes, yes, yes! It's a goblin; fan-*tastic*! I love you, little guy.”

“G-gobu?”

Whether taken aback by my sudden confession of love, or because I had flown in out of nowhere, the creature was totally bewildered. I delivered a full-power gut punch with my Third Hand to send it flying and trampled over its body as I continued onward.

I was so elated, I'd ended up professing my love for a dang goblin. It looked like the monsters showing up were in line with what I remembered.

Now that my biggest worry, whether the encounters were the same, was gone...

“I'll just sprint on through the first ten layers.”

Enemies? Weak. Experience points? Miniscule. Item drops? Garbage. Treasure chests? Didn't know if there were any and didn't care if there were. So what exactly *was* I supposed to do for this group of floors?

Simple. I needed to ignore all the enemies until I reached the boss on the tenth layer.

“At this rate, I should be able to clear ten floors on the first day..... And I'll be able to get plenty of sleep, too. Heck, maybe I should just press my advantage



and keep going?”

Thinking while I ran along, I spotted a goblin looking my way.

He was raring to take me on, but since he was off in the distance, I ignored him and continued forward.

“Phew, I’m beat..... But I made it to the tenth layer.....!”

The boss here was another one of the brown-leafed Wood Golems I had fought before. It might have posed a challenge a few weeks back, but it was now basically just a big scarecrow. I finished it off before it could put up a fight. Didn’t even have to exploit its fire weakness with a magic sigil stone.

If anything, the long-distance running I’d been doing was more of a challenge than the boss at the end. I hadn’t expected *this* would be where my daily running regimen bore fruit. That was supposed to be just for building up my stamina...

I still had some of my first day left over. But beyond this level, there wouldn’t be any monster-free safe zones for a while.

Should I keep going deeper?

Nah. I decided to stop things here. I’d scheduled in a lot of breathing room for the first day of my trek. If I rushed ahead and ended up making a mistake that forced me to flee the dungeon, my whole plan to clear the first forty levels would fall apart.

That was the one thing I wanted to avoid at all costs.

“If this was an RTA speedrun that I could just reset, I’d totally charge forward, though.”

I started getting my bed together. Though really it was nothing more than a simple sleeping bag.

According to what I was told, while there had been cases of people camping out for a day in the Tsukuyomi Academy Dungeon, no one had ever slept inside for a whole week. Well, that was only natural, really. Why the heck would you

insist on snoozing inside the dungeon when there was a spatial magic circle every ten layers that teleported you back to the entrance? There was no question I'd rather be going to sleep back in my bed together with Marianne..... Though lately, I was finding either Sis or Nanami in bed with me when I woke up, instead. Oh boy, did that spook me.

If I stayed in the dungeon for six to seven days, would people start saying I owned the place? Nah, I doubt a mere week was enough for that.

My simple bedding was good to go. Next up: Food. I'd skipped lunch to keep running, so it made sense that my stomach was growling up a storm. I needed to eat well, sleep well, and maintain my energy for the days ahead.

I took out the meals Sis and Nanami had prepared for me.

Nanami had handed me hers and said, "D-don't get the wrong idea or anything, I made this specifically for you, Master." I'd had no clue how to respond. Conversely, the only thing Sis uttered was "Hrm." The two of them had gotten up bright and early to make them for me.

Both of the lunchboxes contained sandwiches.

They must've been considerate enough to go with sandwiches, assuming that I'd actually eat them for lunch, so I could scarf them down on the go. But since I wasn't hungry earlier, I'd reserved them for dinner.

I picked up the lunchbox filled with a humble and very tasty-looking egg sandwich. This was the lunch Nanami packed for me.

She'd carefully calculated when to take the eggs off the boil, cut them into quarters to reveal perfectly runny orange yolks, and covered them with egg salad. Then she'd wrapped it all up with crispy-looking pieces of lettuce before placing them between some bread. A truly gorgeous egg sandwich. It looked absolutely delicious!

Now in a cheery mood, I opened up the lunchbox Sis had given me.

I immediately lurched back.

They looked, well, edible, at least.

Inside were a few uncomplicated spicy sandwiches, stuffed with crisp lettuce

that had been doused in a harsh crimson chili sauce. Or at least that's how they *looked*.

While I hadn't tasted them yet and could only take my best guess, this didn't seem to be as straightforward and simple a sauce as it appeared. Timidly, I brought the sandwich up to my face.

No, this couldn't be possible..... Why?

Why was there such an intense energy-drink smell coming out of this thing? I didn't have the slightest clue. This wasn't the smell of a spicy hot sauce. This definitely reeked of energy drink. For the time being, I picked up one of Nanami's egg salad sandwiches.

"Yup. Delicious."

The fluffy egg salad, perfectly salty runny egg, and fresh vegetables came together inside my mouth to create a wonderful harmony that nearly moved me to tears. I picked up one more, and then another, and it wasn't long before they were all gone.

I took a deep breath. Then I turned my eyes toward the unfathomable sandwiches that continued radiating their intense energy-drink stench.

If there was a choice box displayed in front of me, the three options would be EAT, DIG IN, and CHOW DOWN. An ABSTAIN option wouldn't be available.

Despite how terrible she was at getting up, Sis had miraculously woken up early in the morning to make these for me. I was obviously going to eat them. Of course I would...eat them...

With a trembling hand, I grabbed one of the sandwiches. Compared to Nanami's, the bread was oddly soft.

It wasn't that they *looked* bad. Normally, I would've described it as a very tasty-looking hot sauce. But *oof*, that energy-drink stench. The gap between the smell and their appearance horrified me.

The gap...the gap. Why was I so terrified of it?

If a rough-and-tough delinquent girl was actually really easily embarrassed and bashful at home, would that gap discourage me? If a normally dignified and

dependable big-sister character turned in a marshmallow-like, fawning, and unreliable blob when it came to romantic relationships, would that gap turn me off?

It was the exact same with this sandwich.

As for what specifically was the same in this instance, I hadn't the faintest idea, but I had to think like that to keep myself going.

Steeling myself, I dug into Sis's creation.

What a truly sublime morning. I was in a stuffy dungeon with no sky or windows, yet despite that, why did I feel so refreshed?

I glanced down and found my garments in disarray, as if I had been attacked by something. My clothes were undone and my chest fully bared, with everywhere else in various states of tatters. I looked quite like heartthrob actors on magazine covers, who wore their outfits in a state of sexy dishevelment.

As I adjusted my outfit, I looked around and saw two empty lunchboxes sitting beside me.

*What the heck is in these?* I wondered. There was a nebulous energy-drink stench lingering in one of the boxes.

I checked the time on my stopwatch and clock app and let out a small sigh.

What exactly happened yesterday?

The only thing I could say for certain was that I felt like all of my exhaustion had been wiped away. And for some strange reason, it felt like I was overflowing with vim and vigor.

I couldn't remember anything at all, but I figured it didn't matter either way.

All right then, it was about time to get moving. Today's goal was to get to the twentieth layer! I needed to maintain this enthusiasm and rush through in one big burst of energy! This was the only time I'd really be able to charge through the dungeon.

Because after the twentieth layer, things were going to get real hard, real fast...

I didn't think that the journey from the tenth layer to the twentieth would be too difficult. The monsters here were as strong as the ones that showed up in the panties dungeon and the turtle-farming dungeon. However, starting from the eleventh layer, there was one part that was impossible to avoid and required some degree of strategy. That was...

"Didn't take me long to find one... I knew this ring from the Gloomy Ruins would come in handy."

I hopped over the trap in front of me, then took a nearby rock and threw it inside. When I did, something slid into place with a *clank* before wooden logs appeared out of the wall beside the trap and passed through the other side before my eyes. As if there were no walls at all.

It was a clearly a supernatural phenomenon, the kind that was inconceivable back on Earth. But according to Nanami, this was totally normal. I needed to keep in mind that the traps in the dungeons were just as abnormal as everything else in them.

I placed my hands on the weathered ring.

This thing was so valuable that I'd prepared myself to degrade my reputation to obtain it. Without it, soloing the first forty levels would've been an unrealistic fantasy.

Unfortunately, this ring would only have an effect for the first forty layers. Intermediate traps started popping up after that, which were too much for it. For this trip, I was only progressing up to the fortieth layer, so I'd be able to get by, but I'd need Nanami to work hard for me going forward. Though part of me still wanted to trigger the erotic traps, too... What a contradictory conundrum.

The monsters that started showing up after the tenth layer were completely different from the ones that had appeared on the first ten. Those monsters would be totally swapped out by around the fifteenth layer, but until then, there was one variety that was a real hassle to deal with. And it had just

appeared before me.

The creature had a head like a dog's.

Its tongue dangled from its open mouth, which was lined with sharp fangs. It also carried a club, the sort a Neanderthal might wield, but considering how gangly the monster looked, it didn't seem like a blow from it would hurt very much.

This was my first time seeing it in this world, but it was a staple enemy in almost any fantasy game—a kobold. They were generally treated as trash mob enemies, and *Magical ★Explorer* was no exception.

So what about them was a hassle, exactly? Their speed.

They were fairly agile. Kobolds had poured their stats into agility over strength. Defeating them was easy. I would defend their incoming attacks with my Third Hand and use that opening to either punch them with my Fourth, or finish them off with my katana's iai. While they were fast, their speed wasn't remotely comparable to Yukine's or Claris's.

But when you were planning on running away from them, everything changed.

Since kobolds had good hearing and astute scent-tracking skills, and were reasonably quick on their feet, they were quite difficult to escape from. That didn't mean it wasn't worth going out of my way to kill them all, though.....

The kobold in front of me readied its club and watched my movements carefully.

These monsters are intelligent and won't attack you blindly. Instead, they wait for an opening to go on the offensive. Sometimes they'll even flee when you attack them. But after you are sure they have turned tail, they will come up from behind to ambush you, among other nasty tactics.

Quite the crafty little monsters.

To be honest, this was my first time coming across one. Most of what I knew was secondhand knowledge from Yukine, so I wasn't sure about the attacks from behind and so on. Still, I was taking everything she told me at face value.

That aside, just how long was this guy going to stand there watching me for an opening?

This staredown was simply a waste of my time. I abruptly put my hand in my pocket to grab one of my sigil stones and filled it with mana. Then I chucked it toward the kobold.

The beast dodged it easily. However, since I'd transferred my mana into it, the sigil stone activated as it passed right by it.

“—————!”

A shrill sound enveloped the area.

I sent my Third Hand flying into the kobold as it held down its large dog ears, ignoring the magic stone and particles to continue on.

Wonderful. The sound sigil stone had worked beautifully. While it was one of the cheaper varieties of low-level sigil stones, its effects were outstanding. Depending on how it was used, it had more versatility than the basic elemental sigil stones of fire, water, wind, and earth.

They were so effective, they helped me come out on top against Claris once. She came up with a way to counter it and beat me to a pulp afterward, though.

“These sigil stones are really handy, but...”

Useful and effective. But costly. While they were on the cheaper end, sigil stones themselves still commanded quite a price, so it had been a significant sum overall. As I progressed further, I'd start needing other types of sigil stones, too. Unfortunately, I wasn't able to carry as many as I would have liked.

If I hadn't been born into a family that bought imported sports cars as a sixteenth-birthday present, I would've either needed to give up on my solo forty-layer challenge or put my turtle farming on hold to raise funds. God bless Queen Marino.

There were only going to be more troublesome enemies popping up from here on out, as well as stronger foes in general, so I was going to be bleeding money from every orifice as I continued on. When I finished clearing this dungeon, though, I'd get an item that would make me forget all about the

money I'd hemorrhaged, and the Three Committees' invitation should trigger as well. My wallet would be in real trouble if I failed. Not nearly as bad as a certain teacher I knew, though.

Finishing my sprint through the eleventh layer, I headed to the next. Naturally, I planned on dashing through this one, too.

I'd resolved to cut out any combat between layers eleven to twenty, too, to save time. That wasn't a personal preference, either; I estimated that I wouldn't make it to the fortieth layer in time otherwise.

Assuming I did fight between layers eleven and twenty along the way, the most annoying enemy of all were the bloody bats that started appearing on the thirteenth layer. As their name suggested, they were red, bloodsucking bat monsters. They tended to show up in large groups and were always hovering in the air, which made them irritating to fight. Yukine had told me that in her experience, they appeared in groups about 80 percent of the time.

If Ludie was with me, she could've used magic to knock them down. Similarly, if Nanami was here, she could blow them out of the sky. Me, on the other hand? I was just a monkey throwing rocks. But it wasn't worth spending sigil stones to fight the bats, either. Killing them wasted precious time.

Thus, I concluded that I needed to run away from them. If I had just a little more time, I would've been fine clearing them out a little as I delved deeper underground.

Just then, I turned at a fork in the path and let out an involuntary "*ugh*." In front of me was a group of three kobolds. Three big pains in the ass, in other words.

I quickly shoved my hand into my pocket, took out a few sound sigil stones, and activated them. Casting a sidelong glance at the three monsters writhing in pain and gripping their ears, I resumed my sprint.

It was then that a thought suddenly crossed my mind:

*Wait. Ever since entering this dungeon, I've pretty much run away from every single enemy outside of the boss fights, haven't I?*



Wrapping up the first twenty floors in two days lined up perfectly with my schedule. Given that I'd focused exclusively on running away, it was an easily foreseeable outcome. The twentieth-layer boss, a pig bastard known as an orc, wasn't even worth mentioning. I mean for starters, any pig that didn't fly was just a regular old pig, and any piggy rascal without a bunny girl was just a plain old piggy rascal.

From there, I immediately ate dinner and turned in for the night right afterward, bringing the second day to a close.

I didn't wake up feeling as great as I had the day before. I stretched out my arms, threw back some coffee, and after psyching myself up with a "Layer twenty-one, here I come!" immediately embarked on my dungeon run for the day. The moment I'd been waiting for had finally arrived.

The atmosphere in the twenty-first layer was different from all the layers that came before it.

Put simply, the normal stonework dungeonscape had given way to an interior reminiscent of jungle ruins, with vegetation encroaching into the structure of the dungeon. Tree roots, moss, and the like were growing on the walls and ground. If I didn't watch my step, I could easily trip over them.

Though really, none of that mattered—my problem was with the thing in front of me.

It had finally showed its face. Since *Magical ★Explorer* was indeed an eroge, I definitely wouldn't be able to slip past it.

Its body was small. About three feet tall. Flapping its tiny wings, it pointed its fork-like spear in my direction.

In certain respects, this type of monster was stronger than most of the bosses around this level. It was rare to see an eroge RPG without them; I doubt such a game even existed.

This monster, still staring me down, was dressed in an outfit very unsuited for the location.

A competition swimsuit.

I'd have no qualms if this were a pool. But this was a dungeon. The average person would take once glance at this monster and simply conclude it was a pervert. Though it was a pretty typical sight in an erogé.

Seriously, why the hell was it wearing a competition swimsuit in the middle of an underground labyrinth? On top of all that, the creature had a long, thin tail growing out from somewhere—it wasn't clear if it was coming out of its lower back, its butt, or somewhere in between—with a spade-shaped tip.

Perfectly plump thighs, suntanned skin, and a not-quite-fully-developed chest. All features of its superbly healthy body, which was neither too skinny nor too pudgy.

It was glaring at me, as if to declare that it was going to take me down, but I want to give my truly honest opinion on the monster:

She was absolutely adorable.

“*Whew*, so the sexy monsters are finally showing up. And a bit of a loli one at that.”

The imps that began appearing in the twenty-first layer of the Tsukuyomi Academy Dungeon looked different from the imps that showed up in other games. Monsters that had been tweaked to be cuter and sexier often cropped up in erogé. And most surprising of all was that they were all at least eighteen years old, of course.

If I could befriend monsters, I'd get to know this one straightaway. Even if she was weak, I'd use any item I could to make her capable of standing up to the late-game bosses. Well, by then she'd probably have grown up and turned into a *very* sexy, older lady imp. Though, depending on how she was raised, the “Legal-Loli” option was always there, too.

In truth, up until now, I had avoided these types of creatures. Nanami aside, I had no idea how I should react to them in the presence of Yukine and Ludie. Hell, I didn't even know how I *would* react to them in the first place.

Although there were no imps in the dungeons I introduced to Iori, there should've been other types of erotic monsters that showed up in them. In fact, I'd told him about those mazes on purpose; I wonder how exactly he'd reacted

in front of the other girls in his party?

I'd get him to spill all the details later for my sake. Forgive me for using you as my guinea pig, Iori. But surely, it helped you level up.....

Well, I guess erotic monsters were a regular feature of this world, so who knows? He could be used to them already.

The imp girl looked ready to fly at me at any moment, but I knew exactly how to handle her.

"Here ya go!"

I shoved my hand in my pocket and threw a sound sigil stone at her that instant, then dashed away at full speed. What else was I supposed to do? Being attacked from the air was difficult enough, and her titillating and suggestive form made it harder to deal with.

For starters, I seriously doubted I'd be in any state to fight back, thanks to the deliciously synergistic combo of her midair position and suggestive costume design. If I fought her normally, it'd take all sorts of time. And totally tucker out my brain..... Though, maybe I should have snapped a photo before I ran off.

However, I couldn't exactly run from every single monster I encountered on this floor. If I didn't bring down a certain number of them, I'd run into an experience points deficit.

I understood from my turtle farming that collecting magic particles was an extremely important part of strengthening myself. Farming was the most surefire way of improving my physical body. Though, that didn't necessarily mean my running and practice-strike routines were totally meaningless, either.

I truly felt the results from my daily running, even when I was only using them to flee from everything. My sword-drawing arts would especially prove vital down the line.

"There you are."

In addition to its completely different environment, the twenty-first layer featured different monsters, too. This was as true for the imp I'd encountered earlier as it was for the treant that had just appeared in front me.

Treants are a species of creature similar to wood golems, except I'd say they are closer to actual trees. As for their distinguishing characteristics, they are a so-called power-type that boast high-attack in exchange for low speed. Since they're weak to fire, you can totally shut them down by putting some distance between yourself and them and using fire magic. Though it is possible to overpower them without it.

The treant slowly lumbered toward me, then it swung its branch arm down. As I blocked the blow, it dawned on me just how absurdly strong Yukine and Claris were, before I repelled the creature's limb. Then I instantly launched my Sword-Drawing Arts—Flash—into its exposed stomach.

Since it is mainly a physical-damage monster—and slow, to boot—treants are little more than wooden training dummies once you overpower them. I had plenty of methods at my disposal for taking them out.

I cleanly sliced the creature in two and got a glimpse at the treant's inner wood grain. As I casually thought to myself, *Oh, right, you can figure out a tree's age by counting its growth rings*, the treant dissolved into a magic stone and magic particles.

"These magic stones are getting bigger, too..."

The enchanted rocks dropped by monsters, which were smaller than pigeon feed in the upper layers of the dungeon, had now gotten as big as my pinky finger..... They were still pretty tiny, though. Oh well. According to Ms. Ruija, I didn't need to worry about their size very much due to things like "building blocks," "density," and "condensation of form," or whatever she'd been going on about.

My teacher was incredibly reliable at her job and with magic; just being near her cheered me up. If only she could do something about that terrible money habit of hers.

Treants were also pretty easy to farm, and if these versions were the same as their in-game counterparts, they should have a ton of mana. They dropped pretty valuable magic stones, too. I considered the possibility of farming them here and gathering magic particles before ultimately nixing the idea.

"Why do there have to be poisonous monsters here, too?"

I hadn't come across any yet, but poison toads also appear in the layers where treants show up. If I happened to slip up somehow and get myself poisoned, how would I heal myself?

Items were my only option, and fortunately, I had prepared a fair amount ahead of time. The poison from this layer was pretty weak, so you could treat it with cheap antidotes. Those were a lot easier to buy than magic sigil stones.

That being said, I hadn't brought that many with me. The sigil stones were so dang useful that I'd gone all-in on them instead.

"That was actually a big mistake on my part....."

Even if I didn't plan on fighting the toads, the argument could be made that I should get poisoned at least once. In the game, you can still level up when you're under poison's effects. Since the toxins that showed up on this current layer were weak and barely dealt any damage, some players felt it was just easier to grind without curing it.

I could try doing that myself, but the possibility that the poison could have other effects that weren't immediately apparent in the game had me anxious.

In the game, for instance, sprinting across the map at all times won't diminish your ability to fight in any way. But in this world, the faster and faster I hurried, the more exhausted I became. After running for a while, my breathing would get labored, and I'd experience other drawbacks that weren't present in the game.

Just what sort of drawbacks came with being poisoned in this world? I probably should have figured that out before it came time to jump into this dungeon.

My plan had been to ignore all the monsters besides the treants on this layer. But the possibility that I could get poisoned still remained. I should have tried experiencing that before coming here.

Was it a good idea to try that out now? Nah. I didn't know what might happen, so it was better to hold off. It would be safer to test it out with another person when I wasn't operating under a time limit.

I didn't know for sure, but I figured Sis or Ms. Ruija had some sort of poison

on them. There was no question that Sexy Scientist did. Oh yeah, she absolutely did, I'd swear to the god of eroge on that. Though, it was terrifying to think about what she'd demand in return if I asked for her help.

I'd made my first mistake since coming down here.

Before diving into a dungeon, I'd needed test out everything I could ahead of time. I was going to be heading into plenty more in the future. I could capitalize on this error to make sure it didn't happen again.

There was nothing I could do to fix that in my current run, though. I'd just have to farm treants and flee from everything else.

For now, I needed to clean up the treant that had just showed up in front of me.

The most important element of leveling up, especially in online games, is time. The time it takes to finish a single battle, the time it takes to encounter a monster, the time you spend healing and prepping your characters after the conclusion of a fight. To level effectively in a game, you have to add that all together and head to the most time-efficient area. Though your farming spot of choice often changes when you take item drops into account.

But for speedruns, that paradigm shifts. Since you're focused solely on your route to the end of the game, you need to anticipate everything up to the credits, and consistently take the shortest methods of getting there.

My end-goal was conquering the first forty layers of the dungeon in a week, along with admission into the Three Committees.

Since I felt these goals should be prioritized above all else, I'd sunk almost all my money into preparing for my journey, and I had put myself through a unique training schedule to make that possible. Hell, I'd even offered up three girls' used panties to make it this far.

Collecting magic particles was one of the things I absolutely needed to accomplish over the course of my forty-layer challenge. *All those treants on the twenty-first layer mean I just have to farm them!* Or so I'd thought, but there

had been poison toads there. *In that case, I'll farm them starting on the twenty-fourth layer, when the poison toads stop showing up!* was how I wished things would play out.

It was all too unfortunate, then, that the treants also stopped showing up after the twenty-fourth layer. The imps still continued to appear, though, and I couldn't help but praise the devs for their astute understanding of what the people wanted. If I was able to use long-ranged light magic, or the sort of long-ranged attacks at Nanami's disposal, then they would have been quite lucrative to farm. But I didn't have any of those skills. So if the imps flew up in the air, I'd have to rely on my sigil stones to down them, all while their costumes took a toll on my mind. I could always lure them into a corridor, but the time spent leading them there would go to waste.

"Ultimately, running away's the best choice, really....."

Hobgoblins, stronger versions of goblins that started appearing from this floor on, would carry clubs, swords, bows, and staffs. While their attack patterns changed depending on the weapon they carried, each version was easy to deal with since they were as weak and forgettable as their in-game counterparts.

But while they were easy to kill, to my dismay, they rewarded less experience than the treants. I should've expected as much since they were so weak.

The hobgoblin now standing before me was the bow-wielding kind. But Nanami's bow skills were on a completely different planet compared to this thing. Honestly, a hit from its arrows felt like a punch from a kindergartner. Meanwhile, Nanami's constant barrage of bolts induced nothing but pure terror.

When they appeared in a group, it was a bit more efficient to farm hobgoblins than treants, but they didn't always work together. And when too many of them gathered, accidents happened (messing up and taking damage).

I'd brought a large amount of healing items into the dungeon, but I expected to be using them up left and right after the thirtieth layer, so I didn't want to break into them just yet.

After beating the hobgoblin to a pulp, it was back to running. If there were less than three, I'd fight. If there were more than three, or an imp decided to

tag along, I'd run away.

Hopefully, I could keep progressing like this and get to the twenty-seventh layer without a hitch.

"Never mind, looks like I'm already here."

It had happened in the blink of an eye. I'd rushed my way here a bit faster than I had with the other layers up until now. But that was understandable considering I'd wanted to get here ASAP.

The twenty-seventh layer of the dungeon was a very important one that would control how things would play out for the rest of my run. It was one of the floors where monster encounters swapped out. In my current state, it was also the best map for grinding experience points.

Another noteworthy feature of this floor—the environment shifted again here. Perhaps it was only appropriate that the monsters changed to suit the scenery.

"Except, I'm gonna have to keep my guard up against sneak attacks from here on out."

Starting with this layer, canals and ponds started cropping up amid the jungle ruins environment. As such, water-based monsters grew more frequent.

I headed farther into the twenty-seventh layer. Right as I came upon a large, pond-sized pool of water, it appeared.

My eyes were drawn to its colossal pincers. Along with the huge shell it bore on its back. And a pair of feelers. And yeah, it was big. Height-wise, it looked about as tall as a third or fourth grader, maybe? However, it was about six or seven people wide, and boasted freakishly huge pincers. Too huge, if anything. They threw the creature off balance.

"But that lack of balance is what really screams 'timreh,' huh?"

Timreh are enemies based off hermit crabs, but with extravagantly enlarged pincers. Since the name is simply the word *hermit* spelled backward, players can immediately figure out what they are based on. Official sources even refer to



them as “hermit crabs” occasionally. Many of the terms in *Magical ★Explorer* are just anagrams or words written backward.

I’d be hard-pressed to find a monster better suited for my fighting style than a timreh. They weren’t that fast, and while they resisted slashing attacks, they were weak to blunt ones.

Not only that, but Yukine had told me, *“You can slice through their joints pretty easily. And with your skill, Takioto, I bet you could even cleave through parts of their shells, too,”* so I was probably fine. Now that I thought about it, swords dealt a decent amount of damage to them in-game, which must have represented their joints getting sliced up. At any rate, my best weapon was my stole, so I could simply bash it to a pulp without needing to force myself to cut it at all.

There was one thing I needed to be cautious about.

The timreh turned and started advancing toward me, making a grinding sound as it dragged its claws along. It was faster than I had thought it’d be.

The crustacean swung its pincers up before slamming them down at me. *Seriously, you’re not even gonna grab me with them?* I thought to myself as I turned my Third Hand into a fist to deflect the blow.

I needed to be wary of the enormous claws on these things. While they weren’t sharp enough to cut through everything, those rugged pincers boasted enough strength to snap me in two.

When I sent a full-powered kick to its claws with my powered-up legs, the crab bent far back. Without delay, I sent my Fourth Hand straight into its face.

The timreh flipped onto its back with a loud crack, like something breaking apart. I went for another strike because it didn’t turn into particles, but that didn’t work, either. Rather, I was denied.

Bubbles frothed up and overflowed from the timreh. Its face was immediately covered in bubbles, as if growing a bubbly beard on the spot.

This monster wasn’t venomous, so I didn’t think there’d be any problem getting soaked by them...

“But it’s kinda hard to get in close.....”

Why did it feel so gross to look at? Maybe it was because the bubbles were slimy, or because they were so many of them?

That said, I still needed to fight it. For one, I had planned on wrapping up all the layers from twenty-one to thirty besides this one in just a few hours, so I could stay here for a day or more.

I was going to spend a lot of time here, and all of it would be spent farming, so stalling just because they looked a little gross would be a waste of my precious time.

“All right, let’s do this. One, two...”

I steeled myself and punched its face in. To my surprise, even more bubbles gushed out from its maw. Eventually, it began convulsing before its feet gave way with a jerk and its shell fell to the ground. Finally, it began to slowly dissolve into magic particles.

Hermit crabs seemed like they were saltwater animals, but maybe they could live in freshwater, too? I went to pick up the leftover magic stone as those meaningless, idle thoughts crossed my mind before immediately standing back up. I then kicked the magic stone on the ground away for the time being, making sure it wouldn’t get in the way of the upcoming fight.

“Like a moth to a flame, huh?”

Before my eyes appeared a monster I would be spending a whole day in the twenty-seventh layer to farm.

It had the physique of a child and carried a massive hammer. Coupled with its androgynous facial features, it had an extremely charming appearance. However, the sight of it lugging its huge hammer, likely even bigger than I was, across the ground, was bizarre, without a doubt.

It was a type of fairy monster, a knocker.

Knockers had the outward appearance of a child, but their strength didn’t match their looks in the slightest. More than anything else, that human-size hammer.....wasn’t the big problem.

“Right out of the damn gate?!”

I turned my Third Hand toward the magic circle that appeared in front of the knocker. Then, pumping in more mana than usual, I enchanted it with water.

At the same moment, the fireball that popped out of the magic circle came flying toward me.

The most annoying part about these fairies’ behavior was the fire attacks they launched using sigil stones. Promptly repelling the orb of fire with my stole, I closed the distance between us. However, as though it had been waiting for me to do so, it swung its hammer toward me from the side. I guarded with my Fourth Hand and tried to use my katana iai, but it didn’t work.

The knocker capitalized on the momentum from its swing to jump back away from me.

“What the hell?” I couldn’t help but mutter. Was it an acrobat or something?

It was unbelievably flexible. If I uploaded a video of this to the Internet, it would absolutely go viral, especially because of its boyish appearance.

The instant after it put some distance between us, the fairy grabbed another sigil stone and activated it. At the same time, it readied its hammer and sent it at me.

How unfortunate.

I had asked Yukine, Ludie, as well as Claris, to help me practice against two-pronged attacks. I knew I’d end up being outnumbered a lot inside the dungeon, and training myself to deal with it as best as I could had clearly been the correct call.

Repelling the fireball with my Third Hand, I blocked the hammer with my Fourth. However, this time my Fourth Hand was slightly different from before.

The moment the hammer struck my stole, it made a *fwump* sound, as though it had hit loose fabric, and my Fourth Hand swallowed it up. Just how long did this thing think it had taken me to master subtly controlling my stole’s rigidity like this?

“All right, now I’ll beef up my enchantment, then harden my stole... There.”

The knocker tugged on its hammer, now encased in hardened fabric and unable to be pulled out. It was wide open.

Using my katana’s iai, I cleaved the fairy clean in two. It morphed into magic particles, a magic stone, and a single red gemstone. Looking at it, I couldn’t hold my surprise.

“Huh? N-no way. What’s going on? It doesn’t make sense.”

I reflexively did a double take. My bewilderment far outweighed my happiness.

I wasn’t planning to spend a whole day farming knockers just for the experience points. If anything, they were hard to grind, and there were more efficient locations where I could have done so. Nevertheless, I’d intentionally camped out where I had because the knockers here dropped a lucrative item.

Unfortunately, it had quite a low drop rate. They were still higher than the gacha rates for crappy cell phone games, but at least with those, you could get what you wanted as long as you coughed up the cash.

But there was no pay-to-win option here.

That being said, you could technically purchase this item if you wanted. It was just so expensive that it even put my allowance (equivalent to the yearly take-home of a first-year office worker) to shame. I’d decided to leave it off my shopping list since I wouldn’t have been able to buy anything else if I’d purchased it. If I didn’t have to work so hard to earn this one item, I might’ve been able to shorten my dungeon dive by an extra day. Though, honestly, the Hanamuras seemed like they’d raise my allowance without a second thought if I pestered them enough.

Lying on the ground near the recently defeated knocker was a single magic stone.

When I streamed my RTA runs, everyone had declared me the “RNG fail lord,” so I’d never expected this thing to drop off of the very first fairy I defeated. I mean, I was definitely happy about it, no doubt about that!

I picked it up and got a good look at it. Yeah, I was glad that I always carefully admired all the different items for sale. This was the same item that fetched a pretty penny in the shop, no question about it.

An intermediate fire sigil stone.

Still, it was strange. I had no idea why the knockers dropped intermediate sigil stones when all they used were lesser sigil stones. Well, they did drop the lesser ones, too. They should've gotten off their high horses and used their damn intermediate stones. No matter how their opponent may've looked, they shouldn't have let down their guard. Oh well, whatever.

"Welp, I got my hands on a magic sigil stone..." I remarked, putting away the magic stone from the timreh I had previously kicked away with the arrival of the knocker. I couldn't wipe the big grin off my face.

"Guess I'll farm 'em until I get four more!"

My (optimistic) target time was twelve hours. It was non-stop grinding until they showed up!

.....And so my hell had begun.

Random probabilities will eventually converge...was something I stopped being able to declare with confidence at around hour number six. In the end, it took me about twelve hours, just like I'd originally estimated, before finally getting my hands on the magic sigil stones I wanted. But by that point, I was despondent.

I tried doing *something* to get my spirits back up, which ended up being a sprint all the way to the boss on the thirtieth layer.

From the twenty-eighth floor, the hobgoblins and friends disappeared, with perytons, flying monsters that looked like deer with bird wings, appearing in their place.

Naturally, I ran in the opposite direction of every one of them. However...

“It’s starting to get tougher to fight and flee, too...”

That was partially because the monsters were getting stronger abilities and stats, speed included. But more than anything, they’d gotten a lot craftier.

The peryton that came rushing at me out of the sky while I wrapped up a knocker fight was a great example. I instantly defended against it with my Fourth Hand, but it was an extremely dangerous ambush.

On this floor, the knockers I’d spent hours farming sometimes wouldn’t even bother chasing me at all. No sooner would this strike me as strange than I would run into a bear trap.

Although I was still on layers where the monsters were comparatively easy to deal with, I would be in bad shape from the thirty-first floor onward. From there, it would be nothing but monsters either at or above my level.

For now, I used a (lesser) light sigil stone on the peryton in front of me and made a hasty retreat.

“I’m watching money drain out of me like water..... Though I guess having too much left over at the end wouldn’t be great, either.”

Having too much leftover cash could only be considered a failure to properly predict what you needed for your adventure.

It signified that you hadn’t done enough research beforehand.

But in my defense, I’d been barred from delving into the dungeon prior to the testing period. That was why I’d needed to anticipate what I would need based off my knowledge of the game and questions to Yukine. It really wasn’t my fault I hadn’t foreseen everything.

After using up my entire supply of light sigil stones, I arrived at the thirtieth layer. Like all of the other nice, round numbered levels, there was a boss waiting for me. No surprise there.

The floor was best described as an oval field. A bit like an athletics stadium, but with all the audience seating around it replaced with a water channel.

When I walked into the center of the floor, something in the canal in front of me made a splash.

A dark brown shell surfaced from the water and started to approach me.

The next thing to emerge was a large pincer.

But the claw on this creature wasn't the same as the ones belonging to the hermit crabs that I had just spent more than ten hours fighting over and over again. No, it was much larger—and much thicker—than that. On top of that, this boss's shell wasn't the characteristic shell of a hermit crab, but a carapace enveloping its whole body.

"There you are, Clammbon."

Clammbon was a monstrous crustacean.

Its appearance was totally, 100 percent crab, but its size was far beyond any normal crustacean's. Its pincer alone was big enough to easily lift me off the ground... Actually, it would've likely torn me instantly in two, it was so huge. As I watched the creature raise its massive pincers threateningly in the air...

"Really leaves you wide open, huh."

...I activated the intermediate fire sigil stone I'd readied...

The blast, vastly more intense in heat than its lesser counterpart's, flew vigorously toward Clammbon, which had smugly raised its pincers in the air.

The moment it collided with the crab, a terribly concussive sound shook the area. It felt a bit like an even stronger version of Nanami's Explosive Arrow. I bet she'd eventually reach this level of destruction with more leveling and training.

Now that I thought about it, the pace of Nanami's growth was the most abnormal out of all my party members'...

Orange flames engulfed the whole area, and an explosive gust brought the sweet smell of crabmeat along with it. I was hungry, so I would've loved to enjoy an early dinner, but unfortunately, this guy wasn't going down with a single stone.

There were still some leftover flames in the area, but I sprinted toward the crustacean regardless, its pincers still held aloft. I tried to slice it apart at the joints with my katana, but it thwarted me with its claws.

Immediately putting space between us, I sheathed my sword and prepared

my sword-drawing arts. There, while using my Third and Fourth Hands to protect my flanks, I observed Clammbon's next moves.

The monster was a bit peeved. Its shell had turned red, and it was stamping its many feet, like a sewing machine set to max speed.

Guess the fiery shower was to blame for the red dye job.

While stamping its feet, Clammbon pointed its pincers at me and vigorously waved them up and down. A moment later, it sprayed a massive amount of bubbles in my direction before disappearing.

"Huh?"

Warding off the bubble-like projectiles, I found Clammbon again.

It was so ridiculously fast that I couldn't help but chuckle. It was almost like a colossal-size ghost crab. But the pincer it was sending my way was absolutely no laughing matter.

Even as I parried it with my Fourth Hand, the force of the collision threatened to knock me back. Unable to dampen the momentum, I was only able to prevent myself from being sent flying by bracing myself with my Third Hand.

Its assault didn't stop there. The next moment, it attempted to trample me, legs moving as fast as the needle of a sewing machine.

Protecting myself with my Fourth Hand, I moved out of the way. Clammbon then passed through where I had just been standing and made an arcing turn to stand in front of me. Then it trained its pincer on me, waving it up and down in the air.

I readied my Third and Fourth Hands and placed my real hands on my katana.

After it shook its claw up and down for a fourth, then fifth time, Clammbon suddenly made its move.

It opened its pincer and punched. One look told me that getting caught in that would be bad news, so I promptly jumped to the side.

Clammbon rushed past my previous position, came to a standstill a few paces later, and immediately raised its claws aloft.



Now was my chance. I ran straight toward the monster and used a fire sigil stone. It exploded, drowning the crab in flames, but I jumped straight into the blaze, throwing caution to the wind.

It was hot enough to sear my skin. Well, it probably *was* searing my skin. But I ignored that for the time being. I needed to tear off the boss's legs while it was stunned.

It was so hot I could scarcely open my eyes; I could hardly see a thing. But then, Mind's Eye must have kicked into gear. The more I focused, the clearer I could make out Clammbon's body. And its movements seemed way slower than they were before.

I drew my katana and aimed at its joints.

After I tore off several legs, it didn't take long. Going after each of the remaining off-balance crab limbs, one by one, was easy work. The boss occasionally swung its pincers down at me, but having lost several legs, it wasn't able to brace itself as it attacked. I didn't even have to block all of these blows, so in the end, the creature only left itself more exposed.

I sipped a healing potion and let out a sigh.

"This would've been a tough fight without these intermediate sigil stones..... Makes me a bit worried about the next leg of my journey."

I had a bumpy road ahead. From here, there was an abrupt spike in monster strength throughout the next group of floors.

"From thirty-one to forty, from fifty-one to sixty, and then from sixty-five onward, the monsters all get a lot tougher."

Still, that spike in power didn't mean they were unbeatable. I had come up with plenty of strategies to deal with them, too, so I knew I was going to be fine.

All right. It was time to break out the most basic, yet essential, skill required for all RTA speedruns.

"Now then, I've gotta pray like hell that no monsters show up, and run like my life depends on it!"

The first thing I thought when I arrived at the thirty-first layer was, *What the heck happened to the cave and ruins scenery I'd seen up until now?* The same thing had happened to me before, so it really wasn't that big of a surprise.

"Warm sunlight, a comfortable breeze, clear skies, and a sparkling stream. Just what is this place?"

I didn't even need to ask. This was a dungeon. Not somewhere to spread out a picnic blanket and enjoy sandwiches with everyone under the shade of the trees..... Sandwiches? I felt something in me shudder at the word, but that was probably my imagination.

Of the new monsters that started appearing on the thirty-first layer, the most troublesome would be...

"Pretty much all of them, I'd say!"

Birds, horses, sheep, snakes—no matter what type showed up, they were going to be extremely annoying to deal with.

I did think that I had gotten just about strong enough to clear layers thirty-one through forty. However, that was under the assumption that I was going through them together with a party.

I doubted I would lose in a one-on-one fight with any of these creatures, at least.

But if there were more enemies than that? Or if I had to fight one right after another? If I didn't have any healing items? The tables would undoubtedly turn against me.

If either Ludie or Nanami were with me, I would be able to get through approximately 80 percent of these encounters without using very many consumables. With both of them, we'd have been able to charge through it all without a care.

But for this excursion, I would have to dash through on my own.

You couldn't join the Three Committees without good grades, no exceptions. The question remained as to whether or not I could get good grades on the written exam. Maybe if I threw every ounce of effort I had toward studying, I

could pull off a miracle and manage a good score.

However, the tests also have a practical component.

In the game, the exams are condensed, and you receive a score based on your stats. Because of that, I didn't know much about how they actually worked. Nevertheless, given that I'd been skipping not only my afternoon classes but my morning ones as well, not one ounce of me believed I could manage to pull off a good score. I was terrible with long-ranged attacks, for starters.

Still, the longer it took for me to bring my grades up, the more likely it was that I'd lose my chance to join the Three Committees entirely.

No matter what route you choose in the game, Takioto never joins the Three Committees to begin with. Another character would join them instead.

And since the Three Committees have a member cap, I wanted to join them as quickly as possible. I needed to get one step ahead of Iori.

Once I joined...then I supposed I'd make progress on the library event for the time being? No, I needed to be focusing on how to deal with the monster in front of me right now.

To compare its form to that of an anime, the monster was like a fusion of horse and human. With the lower body of a horse and an upper torso of a human, they were just as much of a standby in fantasy games as goblins—centaurs.

The instant I first saw a centaur in *Magical ★Explorer*, I was absolutely blown away, for multiple reasons. I couldn't believe how they looked.

The horse half, I got. The splendidly toned and muscled lower body kicked hard against the earth and looked ready to rush off at a speed far beyond anything a human could match.

I could understand their weapons, too. A bow fit their design like a glove.

But why then, I wondered, did the human upper half look like a dapper, middle-aged man?

Eroge RPGs were typically happy to gender-swap centaurs into female versions. They were often designed with a busty and voluptuous upper body to

complement their stout, equine lower bodies.

But the centaurs of *MX* are different. They are, without exception, handsome older men. When I'd first stumbled upon them while playing, it had been enough to make me question if this was really *Magical ★Explorer* or not.

I'd seriously wondered at the time if I had been duped into buying a fake version of the game. It made me so suspicious that I messaged my friend about it and went on the game's message boards to double-check. Unfortunately, at the time, all this told me was that I was further along in the game than most.

Well, female centaurs appeared under a different name a few dozen layers down the line, and the feeling of relief I got from seeing them was still fresh in my mind. An eroge RPG without female centaurs in it was like strawberry milk without the strawberries.

Now, when it came to centaurs...

"It's their speed more than their weapon. That's the problem, really..."

The centaur readied its bow, conjuring a black arrow with magic and notching it in place. Then, it fixed its aim at me...and fired.

*"Hngh!"*

Exactly as it released its arrow, I opened up my Third Hand. It was faster than Nanami. I was able to easily repel the arrow, but the centaur readied its next arrow and immediately fired again.

While I dodged the attack, I decided to start running, both as a test and to take stock of the monster. Fortunately, this lone centaur was the only monster to appear.

".....Yup, they sure are fast."

The centaur held the advantage in terms of sheer speed. And while I hadn't looked into it at all, I surmised that it had me beat in stamina as well.

From there, though I tried to get away from the area as I warded off its attacks, I found myself in a bit of a sticky situation.

The monster was about as strong and fast as I'd expected. But what I hadn't anticipated was...

“I can’t get away...!”

Using a last-ditch sound sigil stone to put a fair bit of distance between us, I was finally able to escape.

In the game, it was so easy to flee from enemies, too. Why exactly was it so hard in real life?

After mulling over why this would be the case, it finally hit me.

“Maybe it’s got something to do with the environment?”

Up until now, I’d been mostly running away from enemies in interior locales; maybe that was why I’d been able to escape.

Before this layer, monsters that threatened me wouldn’t often pursue me if I went down to the next layer. There had been a few exceptions, but in those cases, I’d just keep forging ahead, clearing floor after floor. Before I knew it, they would’ve stopped following me.

“What a fantastic view.”

This area had so few places to hide that if you tried to play hide-and-seek here, the game would be over before it started.

I had a terrible feeling about this.

“Maybe there’s some sort of requirement I’ve got to meet.”

Perhaps I was in their territory, and they would keep chasing me until I left it. It seemed plausible.

For now, I set that aside as a potential explanation.

As for one other possible cause, maybe it was because I was weak?

But in *Magical ★Explorer*, agility influenced your ability to escape. Sure, the centaurs were fast, but not so fast that I wouldn’t be able to get away from them.

So what did it mean if I couldn’t flee them?

For starters, it could indicate that I was wrong to assume things were the same as in-game. The game simply calculated things based on the numerical values of your character’s speed and your opponents’. Your ability to escape

ultimately depended on its results.

But here, I was up against real creatures. Living beings known as monsters. Maybe their decision to pursue me or not was a product of their instincts.

If that was the case, then this was really just nature taking its course.

“Maaaaan, I really want to test some of this out.....!”

I didn’t have the time for that, though. Actual tests were one thing, but who knew how long it would take to gather data from a bunch of different angles and scrutinize the results.

What I could say for sure was that I needed to move fast. Staying here was only going to pointlessly waste time. Now that even running away had become its own ordeal, I needed to advance to the next layer, and the one after that, as fast as I could.

I glanced around the area. A vast grassland stretched out before me. In the distance, I got a brief glimpse of what seemed to be a monster.

“Truth is, my situation’s not looking too great, huh?”

Escaping monsters wasn’t my only problem.

“I have no idea if I should just keep on moving ahead or not.”

When the dungeon had consisted of corridors alone, I could rely on the cardinal directions to know where I was going and to progress through them. With a flat, expansive floor like this, though, the two-dimensional game map and the three-dimensional world in front of me didn’t match up as clearly.

If only I could make out some sort of landmark.

“If the spatial gate to the next layer was the same as the one I just went through, maybe that’ll stand out?”

I remembered that when I arrived on this floor, there had been stonework under my feet.

There was a magic circle on top of it as well, so maybe I just needed to search for some stone flooring to get to the next layer?

But just where would that be?

This didn't bode well for the rest of my expedition, considering this was still the very first layer after thirty.

For the time being, I had to hope. Hope that I'd find it soon.

"This is way too hard....."

After passing through the thirty-first layer and all the way to the thirty-third, something had started to dawn on me.

"If I see an enemy, I can't get too close."

Carelessly approaching them would start combat. Conversely, if I kept my distance, they would usually steer clear of me.

The catch, however, was that there were *a lot* of them.

"Yeeep, this is absolute murder..."

One-on-one fights, I was fine with. Although they'd take up a fair bit of time, I could win. But things got really tough when monsters showed up in the multiples, regardless of how much harder my sparring matches with Claris and the others may have been in comparison.

I'd been able to keep my spirits up for now, but if things got any more trying, I wasn't sure what was going to happen.

The fact that this was taking more time than anticipated was also weighing on me. I may have been bathed in warm sunlight, but this was a dungeon. Checking my watch, it was fair to say evening had set in, with dinnertime being only a few hours away. I had planned to be on the thirty-fifth layer by now.

For today, it would behoove me to rest after I finished taking down layer thirty-three. I was behind schedule, but I had accounted for needing one extra day anyway when I originally planned everything out, so I was still safe. If I needed to use this extra day of leeway, I had figured this would be where I'd end up using it, too.

This wasn't the only thing nagging at the back of my mind. I was also resorting to items more than I had anticipated. I'd intentionally bought extra so that I

would have plenty to spare. But when I thought of how much dungeon I still had left to clear, I could foresee that extra buffer running out. In the worst-case scenario, my supply might not last until the fortieth layer.





But there were some instances where I couldn't get away without expending items, leaving me no other options. Heck, I'd even had a few close calls after using them.

And in light of the monsters that appeared from the thirty-third layer on, I could tell my item consumption was going to accelerate.

Before me was a voluptuous female monster, loudly flapping her winged arms, which were nearly as big as I was, and staring down at me—a harpyia.

Harpyias were the monster I least wanted to encounter from layers thirty-one to forty. This partially came down to the same reason I'd been wary of the imps.

The imps were small and cute, while the harpyia were large and cute. Their facial features looked somewhat childish as well, so they resembled a well-developed adult with a youthful, girlish face.

If a harpyia walked into a bar, she was more likely than not to get ID'd at the door. Imps and knockers, meanwhile, were clearly *never* getting into the place to begin with.

There were several different things to pay attention to when fighting the harpyias. First was the swaying of their busty chests, freed from the vile scourge of clothing, along with the chestnut-colored bra holding them..... No, those weren't important, but, well, they did warrant *some* consideration.....

What I really needed to look out for were the sharp, hawkish talons that extended out from their feet.

According to my research and what Yukine had told me, they'd aim those claws at me before swooping down on me from above. They would occasionally use wind magic, too.

The best measure for dealing with harpyias...?

"Running away from them, of course....."

But there was still a problem. Magic stones. While sound sigil stones and fire sigil stones were effective against them, they could be found on layers thirty-

three through forty. That was a long stretch.

Was it wise for me to consume a magic stone every time one of them showed up?

My item usage had already gone through the roof fending off the horses and snakes, so could I really afford to use them on individual monster encounters? Considering the abilities they possessed, though, it seemed inevitable that I would have to resort to the items, even for one-on-one fights.

Though with this encounter now, I planned on using some stones to test if they would truly prove effective. Single monster encounters were the best for experimenting. I, for one, didn't know what would happen, so it was important to first secure the safest testing environment possible.

Taking a lesser sigil stone, I aimed it at the harpyia and activated it.

First was fire. Likely because I had seen the effects of the intermediate version, the fireball this stone produced looked piddly and unreliable. But the harpyia didn't want to get hit with it all the same, so she hastily dodged the attack.

She was fast.

This creature was probably the most agile out of all the monsters I had faced up until now. After evading, she immediately pointed her sharp claws at me and swooped down.

Slicing through the wind, she plummeted toward me, like a monster-sized arrow.

The monster was approaching with terrifying speed, but her attack was far too straightforward. Though it didn't look difficult to dodge, I decided to take the attack on purpose.

I stopped her with my Fourth Hand, using my Third Hand to prop myself up. There was a loud clang of metal meeting metal, and the impact rattled my whole body. However, it ended at that.

Compared to Clammbon, the creature's attacks were weak. They still proved annoying in other ways, though.

“Yeah, these chicks are seriously fast.”

Using my Fourth Hand as a kickoff point, the harpyia flew back up into the air. This time, she opened her mouth wide and let out a loud shriek.

I couldn't help clicking my tongue. There were still a number of things I still wanted to test, but I probably needed to get away from here as soon as possible—or rather, it appeared that I was already too late.

Deflecting an arrow that flew in from my flank, I shifted my focus toward the attacker. Standing there was a centaur.

The most annoying thing with harpyias was that they would call for other monsters to come help. That would've been hugely beneficial if I were here to farm magic particles with an entire party. But going it alone, I was practically useless against flying monsters.

An arrow struck the ground at my feet with a *thud*. It must have been conjured with magic, for the next instant, it disappeared as if it had never been there at all, leaving behind only a hole in the dirt.

The centaur had come close to hitting me with those two arrows. But if I turned my attention to it, the harpyia was bound to swoop down and attack me, too.

Either that, or she would call for even more reinforcements.

I was clearly at a combat disadvantage. But was escape even an option here?

If I was going to take them down, I needed to do something about the harpyia first. Seeing as she was leisurely hovering in the air, I would have to resort to either primitive rock-throwing attacks or using consumable items.

In other words, escape was my *only* option here.

However, it took me another thirty minutes to fully escape from her.

“Harpyias are way too difficult to deal with.”

Finishing my dinner, I was lost in thought as I sipped the coffee I'd brewed.

I had originally planned to be done with the thirty-fifth layer by now. In

reality? I was currently on the thirty-fourth layer, and even though I hadn't taken a single step past the entrance, I was already about to turn in for the night.

I would be in trouble if things kept up like this. I needed a way of dealing with the harpyias, and I needed it now.

I understood a few things about them now, such as their extreme wariness. I also knew it would be difficult for me to get them out of the sky. I could manage dealing with just one of them, somehow. But they still had a trick up their sleeve that was tripping me up.

"There's gotta be something I can do about them calling for help....."

In the game, harpyias are useful eye candy that call more sources of experience points to you without you having to lift a finger. But that may have been why they were an absolute nuisance to escape from in real life.

It was also annoying that they didn't summon another one of their own, but a mobile centaur instead. Fortunately, the centaurs stopped showing up on the thirty-seventh layer, but that was still far off. Another annoying monster would show up later on, anyway, so it was a wash. If anything, the layers where those other monsters showed up more frequently would be even harder to deal with.

I'd known that this challenge was going to be difficult. But I'd assumed everything would work out if I just ran away; this was proving a lot more harrowing than expected.

Up until the thirtieth layers, it had been smooth sailing.

Nonetheless, it would've been difficult to anticipate this and try to get here even faster. There was nothing more I could've done to speed up my route, besides cutting down on breaks to keep sprinting past everything. Even if I'd skimped on resting as much as possible, however, that would have saved me a few hours at most. Would that have been worth it? Either way, I'd be pushing myself to my limits for sure.

The best solution to tackle the problem was likely the sound sigil stones. They had an effect on the evasive harpyias even without a direct hit, and I could create an opening the moment I activated it.

Unfortunately, however...

“I only have a few left.....”

If it were possible to exchange my other magic stones for them, I would've done so in a heartbeat.

I had a little extra of each elemental magic stone besides fire. Should I have held off on buying them and opted for more sound sigil stones instead?

Nah, that would've been impossible. I couldn't have prepared the perfectly optimal item line-up without an initial test run. If anything, I should have been praising myself for preparing so well, all things considered.

Since sound sigil stones were comparatively inexpensive, maybe I had just used them too extravagantly?

At any rate, for now I needed to sleep. Staying up any later would affect my performance tomorrow.

My thoughts after overcoming the thirty-fourth and thirty-fifth layers were that they had gone much better, comparatively speaking.

Though I'd been in for a difficult battle whenever a harpyia showed up, by fleeing the moment I saw them and forging ahead, things had basically worked out.

Now that I was on the thirty-sixth floor, however, I would have to deal with yet another pesky opponent, albeit one not quite as tricky as the harpyias.

As it happened, the very first monster I encountered on this layer was a harpyia. Leaning up against a tree and basking in the sun, I just barely suppressed the urge to sneak up behind her and beat her to a bloody pulp. Instead, I put some space between us and ran off.

Though punching her to a pulp would've been a great way to blow off some steam, if another harpyia had noticed me and called for their friends, it would've been an absolute disaster.

After I progressed a bit, the thirty-sixth layer produced a new monster for me

to stumble upon: the taotie.

The majority of a taotie's body resembles a sheep, but its face is like a guardian dog or lion statue, with sharp white fangs sprouting out from its mouth. If it bit me with those chompers, I bet it'd take a big chunk, or even worse, snap me clean in two. The curled horns sprouting from their heads made them resemble a fusion of a sheep and a guardian lion.

Though taotie had a few annoying attributes, the most bothersome was their speed. In *Magical ★Explorer*, their agility stat is on par with that of centaurs. I was impressed, really, that they had the nerve to be so fast when their bodies were more sheep than anything else.

Unfortunately, it looked like running away from it would take me some time.

The taotie noticed my presence and stepped sideways with a loud growl to threaten me. When I filled my Third Hand with mana and approached it, the taotie spat fire in my direction.

In addition to their speed, their ability to attack from far away is also a nuisance.

Using my Third Hand to protect myself, I hastily moved from my position. The taotie followed my movements, changing the direction of its flames.

While the taotie's fire breath was more powerful than a lesser sigil stone, it was nowhere near the level of an intermediate one, so it wasn't too threatening. That being said...

"If they show up with centaurs and harpyias, I'm going to be in real trouble."

If monsters like centaurs and harpyias joined up with these things, which could pull off both melee-ranged attacks and spit fire from afar, I'd be dodging attacks from all angles.

With that in mind, I needed to break through this floor and the next quickly.

That's why I was calling it now. These areas, where it was one troublesome monster after another, would be where I'd expend most of my sigil stones.

Enchanting my Third Hand with water, I pushed forward through the taotie's flames. When the creature cut off its breath and pounced forward in an



attempt to maul me, I sent it flying with my Fourth Hand. Then I used my sword-drawing arts.

A single taotie was worth taking on. So was a single centaur. Two or more, and I'd have to take stock of the area and decide whether to fight or flee. If there was a harpyia, I'd book it, even if it cost me a mountain of items in the process.

This sort of game plan ran through my head as I absorbed the taotie's magic particles and collected its magic stone.

Then, dashing off, I quickly ran into another encounter. Oh boy, I'd found it all right. Regretfully, it seemed my next opponent was a harpyia.

"Man, they might not have been total pushovers in the game, but you could still run away from them just fine."

To make matters worse, the harpyia was flanked by not one, but two taoties.

Were they out for a stroll? She'd picked a real nightmare crew to take on a walk. If the two taoties happened to be a couple, their kids would definitely make their little walks a lot more hectic.

While these boneheaded thoughts drifted through my head, I veered off the path. Unfortunately for me, there was a centaur on this side instead.

The harpyia's group was now closing in on me; guess I shouldn't have hesitated about how to proceed.

It would have been one thing if the taoties had stayed together, but as if to spite me, they'd cleanly split into two groups. It looked like they knew damn well how to corner their prey.

I promptly grabbed a sound sigil stone and prepared to activate it. I needed to decide before the centaur came over whether I was going to run away or clean this group up.

I aimed at the harpyia descending toward me and activated a fire sigil stone and sound sigil stone.



“.....”

I couldn't get any words out.

I hadn't expected the thirty-sixth layer to be this trying. The special-made, high-quality uniform that Marino had excitedly ordered for me was in tatters.

While my body was unharmed, that was only thanks to my healing items. My mental state, on the other hand, was just as shredded as my clothing.

“What am I going to do.....?”

At this point, moving was a hopeless endeavor. I needed to, yet I didn't want to move an inch. Even though I understood I was in serious trouble, I still didn't want to move.

Although I had somehow managed to get through the thirty-sixth layer, the remaining thirty-seventh, thirty-eighth, thirty-ninth, and fortieth meant I was still a long way from done. In spite of this, my body—or, more accurately, my mind—was totally spent. Night was fast approaching, so it was about time to have dinner and go to sleep.

But after waking up, I would need to conquer the remaining four layers and the boss in just one day.

Could I kick my pace into high gear starting tomorrow? Maybe if I had an unlimited supply of magic sigil stones. But in all honesty, that seemed impossible.

I'd ended up going through a serious amount of sigil stones on the thirty-sixth layer, and there was a distinct chance that I'd use up all the items I'd prepared before the fortieth layer. However, I needed to throw away the optimistic notion that I could preserve some of my magic stone stock on the thirty-seventh layer. The harpyia and taotie combo, plus the centaurs that backed them up, was dreadful.

My only saving graces were that the centaurs stopped appearing after the thirty-sixth layer, and monsters who moved even slower than the turtles in the Ancestral River Pool appeared instead.

Gah, these were exactly the times when I wanted to fix something up and

have myself a delicious meal, even if it was simple.

But I wasn't in the mood to do anything.

Sheesh, this was an *awful* sign.

I picked out a few thick, filling cookies, unwrapped them, and tossed them into my mouth.

There were no two ways about it—things weren't looking good. My spirit was worn down, and I felt like I was losing the ability to feel anything.

Normally, I'd try to sing some songs from eroge to lift my spirits and help me refocus, but I couldn't get past a single verse before I gave up, exhausted. I couldn't even spare the energy to sing.

I understood that keeping my frame of mind steady was the most important thing of all, but I simply couldn't improve my mood.

I now had just three layers to go, but still, that was three whole floors. Would I really be able to reach the fortieth level in a single day?

The fortieth layer was home to a boss. Was I really in a state to take it on? I stared at the cookies I was forcing down.

They were chalky and dry. Tasted awful. Even when I chased them with coffee, I didn't feel satisfied at all.

A bath. I really wanted to take a bath. Rinse off in a hot shower, use the luxurious tub in Marino's house, and stretch out my arms and legs nice and slow.

*What if I just went back up to the surface from here?*

The thought crossed my mind.

I had gotten plenty far enough, hadn't I? If I went back now, I was guaranteed to get the top score in the class, and I'd be able to join the Three Committees, too. I might not be able to claim the first-time clear bonus, but there were still

other places I could grab the same item at some point. This was just the fastest way to get it, and with the easiest conditions to meet.

The more and more I thought about it, the more I felt fine with it. That nothing was more dangerous than pushing yourself too far.

I could challenge this dungeon whenever I wanted. I couldn't afford to die.

When I shoved my hand in my pocket, I felt three square objects beside my return stone.

I took them from my pocket.

They were protective charms.

One had unbelievably clean stitching, so beautiful it was as if a machine had sewed it all. Embroidered on its surface were a small waterfall and the stream it fed into.

The second was composed of high-quality white fabric and featured an image of a maid wearing an extra-long scarf.

The seams of the final protective charm were, honestly, not very good. However, they were securely stitched and kept everything from coming apart, and there was a clover embroidered in the bottom right corner.

All of a sudden, I thought back to an event in the Hanamura house.

I'd returned from turtle-farming with Nanami to find Yukine, Ludie, and Claris cleaning up the living room in a mad rush. They seemed a bit standoffish, too, as if they were trying to keep what they were doing a secret.

Noticing them, Nanami appeared slightly displeased as she elbowed me gently and said, "You lucky dog, you." When I heard her mumble, "If I just had the time...no, I'll just push myself to fit it in somewhere..." I told her off.

"So take a damn break, then. You work way too much."

"Do you wish to rob me of my moment of supreme bliss, Master?!"

“How the hell is the time you spend working a ‘moment of bliss’?!”

From there, we devolved into our normal comedy routine, with Claris being the first one to see us and chuckle. Marino, who had come home at some point, prepared tea and coffee for us. Sis merely listened along in silence, though she appeared to be enjoying our display. And before I knew it, Yukine and Ludie joined in, and we were all laughing away.

The following day, Yukine had handed me a protective charm with a shy smile. Told me she was “praying for my success.”

After that, Nanami had gifted me a charm, too. She had seemed slightly out of it a few days before that, so she must’ve been pulling all-nighters to finish it. Ludie had looked so worried, I’d thought she would cry.

Then... Her arms wrapped around my body, my hands over hers.

I gripped the charms in my hand tightly.

I thought that I’d try going just a bit longer.

I wasn’t going to give up.

Now that I was blowing through my items left and right, I was able to easily get through the thirty-seventh layer—so easily that it was like the thirty-sixth had never even happened.

Well, actually, I must’ve had a really rough go of it. The amount of time it had taken made that clear.

Still, I was in this strange sort of trance where the hardships didn’t feel so hard. My thoughts were also perfectly clear, for a reason I couldn’t quite pin down.

After getting through the thirty-seventh floor, layers thirty-eight and on were a breeze. The harpyia appearance rate dropped drastically, replaced by a kind of slow-moving bull monster. The things were so sluggish, they were practically begging me to run away from them.

Another advantageous change was that when the harpyias did show up, they

now called bulls to their aid.

What did they expect to get out of calling those slowpokes? I simply used the opening to deal with the harpyia and left the summoned bulls in the dust.

Continuing on like this, I reached the fortieth layer around noon. I was overjoyed that I had gotten used to these levels, along with the harpyia. That, and I was glad that more low-agility monsters had started to show up. I got through almost all the floor without getting bogged down in difficult fights.

However, my stock of sound sigil stones was empty.

Even if I still had some, though, the time to use them had passed.

I took a leisurely lunch in front of the magic circle that led to the fortieth-layer boss. For some reason, my magic stone stove wasn't working properly, so I used a lesser fire sigil stone to send some fallen branches and leaves up in flames.

Thanks to that, I was able to heat up some soup and brew some hot coffee.

Up until now, I hadn't ever once lit a fire with a sigil stone. I panicked when the force of the flames originally scattered the branches and tinder I had gathered together. I couldn't help smiling when I looked down at the miserable sight left behind after everything had blown apart.

I was in a fantastic mood. Now, there was just one floor left.

What did I do after finishing lunch? I lay down and took a break. I wanted to challenge the boss in tip-top shape.

Because appearing on the fortieth layer wouldn't be the original boss that regular students faced when they came this far, but a hidden boss that only appeared during a solo first-time clear.

There was an arena, the kind that looked like it would be at home in some European ruins. An oval field where gladiators clashed, encircled by seats for an audience.

But there was no one seated in the stonework galleries, and I was the only soul standing in the arena.

Then, a single ray of light shone on the opposite side of the arena from where I was. Looking toward the source of the light, I could make out a single silhouette.

I gently touched the charms I had fastened to my bag, like I was patting a child on the head, before taking a deep, deep breath. Then, I placed them in my pocket.

Slowly, a man descended from the sky. On his back sprouted two gray wings, and without flapping them once, he touched down on the ground.

He wore armor that resembled that of the ancient Romans, with a sword nearly three feet in length secured to the strap at his waist. On his arm was fastened a circular metal shield.

He turned to me, folding up the wings at his back. They were like the wings of an enormous swan.

His appearance bore a close resemblance to images of angels found in paintings.

I knew different, though. He was no angel.

“Hello, Icarus.”

Naturally, of course, he didn’t say a word back. His handsomely chiseled face didn’t move a muscle, and he continued to stare hard at me. I placed my hand on my sword and reinforced the mana flowing through my stole. Only when I took a step toward him did he finally draw his sword.

Swinging my body in a side-to-side feint, I sent a punch from my Third Hand toward Icarus.

I thought I had put a fair amount of force in my punch, but Icarus hunkered down and took the full impact with his shield. He didn’t budge an inch from where he stood.

I sent my Fourth Hand out in front of me to take his blade, swinging toward me as if in payback for my previous attack. I thought that I would then use the opening to release my sheathed sword. However...

“Just how much muscle does this dude have? Nearly sent me flying.....”

I needed to be more careful about blocking his attacks. The weight behind each was even greater than Clammbon's. Quickly discarding any thoughts of going on the offensive, I focused myself on dodging. Icarus's follow-up attacks came at me in rapid succession. Sometimes it was his sword, sometimes his shield, and sometimes his legs.

He was also faster than the harpyias. All his stats were head and shoulders above the monsters I had seen up to now.

But that was to be expected. Icarus wasn't a boss that was supposed to show up on the fortieth layer. He was a deep-layer class of monster, placed here to challenge beefed-up characters going through their second playthrough.

If a party who struggled to get through the fiftieth layer tried to take him on, they'd definitely lose. Even I would be almost guaranteed to bite the dust if I hadn't prepared. And my victory was still far from guaranteed. He was simply that strong.

Icarus slowly floated up and flew into the air, then pointed the tip of his sword toward me. Rays of sunlight reflected off the blade.

The moment only lasted long enough for me to think: *I've got a bad feeling about this.*

Sword still pointing straight at me, Icarus began his descent. He rapidly began picking up speed.

All of a sudden, I remembered that the stoop of a peregrine falcon was faster than a bullet train. At that instant, a cold chill went down my spine.





My entire body was telling me I couldn't afford to take this hit. Channeling all the strength I could muster into my legs, feet, and limbs (Third and Fourth Hand included), I immediately dashed away, evading the blow.

A burst of air.

*Whoosh...* No, it wasn't a simple sound like that. It was like the loud *GWOOOO* of a rocket. A direct hit would send me flying at best and tear me to pieces at worst. One wrong step and I'd meet my doom.

However, I had fully prepared a way to counter it.

"Do you know how many stupid knockers I had to fight to get all of these?"

Icarus flew back up in the air again, and I put all of my strength into dodging his swoop attack. He seemed to realize his attack wasn't working, so he flew in low toward me.

I purposefully blocked the full blow of Icarus's sideways sweep as he closed in. Then, using the momentum of his attack to jump sideways, I activated a sigil fire stone (intermediate) and aimed it at his wings.

"\_\_\_\_\_!"

Icarus's weakness was fire. The game developers must've taken a page out of the original Greek myth. The story of Icarus flying high with his wax wings, only to melt as he drew close to the sun, was known far and wide.

Seriously, thank goodness he had this weak point to exploit. Without it, my solo run through the first forty layers would have been doomed from the start.

His wings melted, and he roared a silent scream as he fell to the ground. Then he cast a sharp glare toward me, so I consoled him with another attack.

Just as I got ready to make my follow-up strike, however, he rolled away and retreated backward.

Icarus was now a shadow of his once angelic-looking self.

His splendid wings had melted away; there were now two white, sinewy muscles stretching from his back where his wings had once been. With his body also burned dark red by the flames, he looked terribly pathetic.

He wasn't discouraged, though. Standing up, he pointed his sword my way and fixed his eyes on me.

Right after he kicked off the ground with his legs, he swung his sword at me. Whether it was from losing his wings, or from his burns, I couldn't tell, but the power of his swing had dulled slightly. But right after confirming his strike wouldn't go through, he changed his approach, occasionally using his shield to push me and create some sort of opening as he assaulted me from all angles.

As I watched him boldly rise in the face of his injuries, a thought suddenly crossed my mind:

*What strength he has.*

Icarus really was incredible. His wings were gone, his body was burned, so he could've easily felt totally defeated. Yet he'd gotten back up despite it all. Not only that, but he was pressuring me with attacks that were even more innovative than before.

Watching him, I thought:

*This is the type of guy I wanna be like.*

What exactly was my strength? Where did it come from?

Kousuke Takioto's vast mana pool? Power derived from my knowledge of the game? Might earned through my effort and training?

All of that was probably part of it.

But was that really all there was to it? Could I have gotten to this layer with that alone?

I could definitively say it would've been impossible.

I probably would've been bested along the way. I would've gotten discouraged. Clammbon might have even proven too much for me. I might've

ended up encircled by harpyias and killed.

It was thanks to my friends that I'd been able to battle my way here. No doubt about it.

If Claris hadn't coached me nearly every day, if Yukine hadn't empathetically taught me sword techniques, if Ludie hadn't helped me out with my special training regime, if Sis and Marino hadn't shared their knowledge of locations, tools, and more, I surely would've stumbled somewhere along the way.

It was a strange sensation. For reasons unknown, even as my thoughts drifted beyond the battle in front of me, I was still able to parry or dodge every single one of Icarus's attacks.

The more I concentrated, the more his movements seemed to slow.....

How many times had our blades clashed by now?

Icarus must've thought he was getting nowhere. He was stepping in closer to me, slashing sideways with his weapon faster and more wildly than before. Still, I had a clear grasp of his swordplay. I took an attack with my Third Hand and pretended to lose my balance.

Icarus must've taken this to be his chance. Trying to press me further, he bashed his shield in my direction. But my Fourth Hand was there to defend me from it.

In that instant, it seemed to him that my guard was full of holes. He swung his sword high up into the air. The blade gleamed in the sunlight as it bore down. I drew my katana in sync with his timing.

I could win.

Unfortunately, things didn't go that way. My slice bounced off his body, barely leaving behind a scratch.

“\_\_\_\_\_”

What had happened? Right then, I was sure I had cleaved Icarus in two. But my sword hadn't gone through.

As I quickly opened up space between us, I looked the monster over, unconsciously muttering to myself.

“No way.....”

Wave after wave of yellow magic was flooding out of Icarus's body.

What in the world was this phenomenon? Actually, no, I knew of a similar event. This was his rage mode.

In *Magical ★Explorer*, rage mode triggers when a monster's HP falls below a set amount, powering up all its stats. That's what ended up activating right at that moment. However, the Icarus I was familiar with wasn't supposed to enter rage mode without his wings.

No, that wasn't what I needed to think about. I had to concoct a strategy, and fast. Though that was my intention, something even more unanticipated happened that left me even less room to breathe.

Icarus actually threw his shield aside and brandished swords in both of his hands.

Still shaken by the unexpected development, the boss kicked off the ground and jumped straight toward me, swinging both his swords down.

The attack was hefty.

Despite defending with my Third and Fourth Hands, the force of the blow nearly sent me tumbling. I sensed his speed and his strength had risen several levels.
