"Speaking of that, you got tossed into Hozuki Castle once, right, Naruto? You peeked into the ladies' bath, huh?"


"I'm telling you that was my mission!"

"Master Guy said he really wanted to ride on the ship. So I brought him there in secret today. Master Kakashi went after him... I'm sorry!"


"That Guy!" Tsunade's voice shook with anger. "I will murder him."

"W-what is that?!" the stunned villagers shouted in surprise as they looked up from their daily business out on the streets. "An enormous flying fish!"


"Sai." Tsunade set her chin down over her laced fingers and closed her eyes. "How long before the Tobishachimaru reaches Hozuki Castle?"

Haven't I just been using the loss of the sharingan as an excuse to run away from the position of Hokage? he thought, abruptly.


