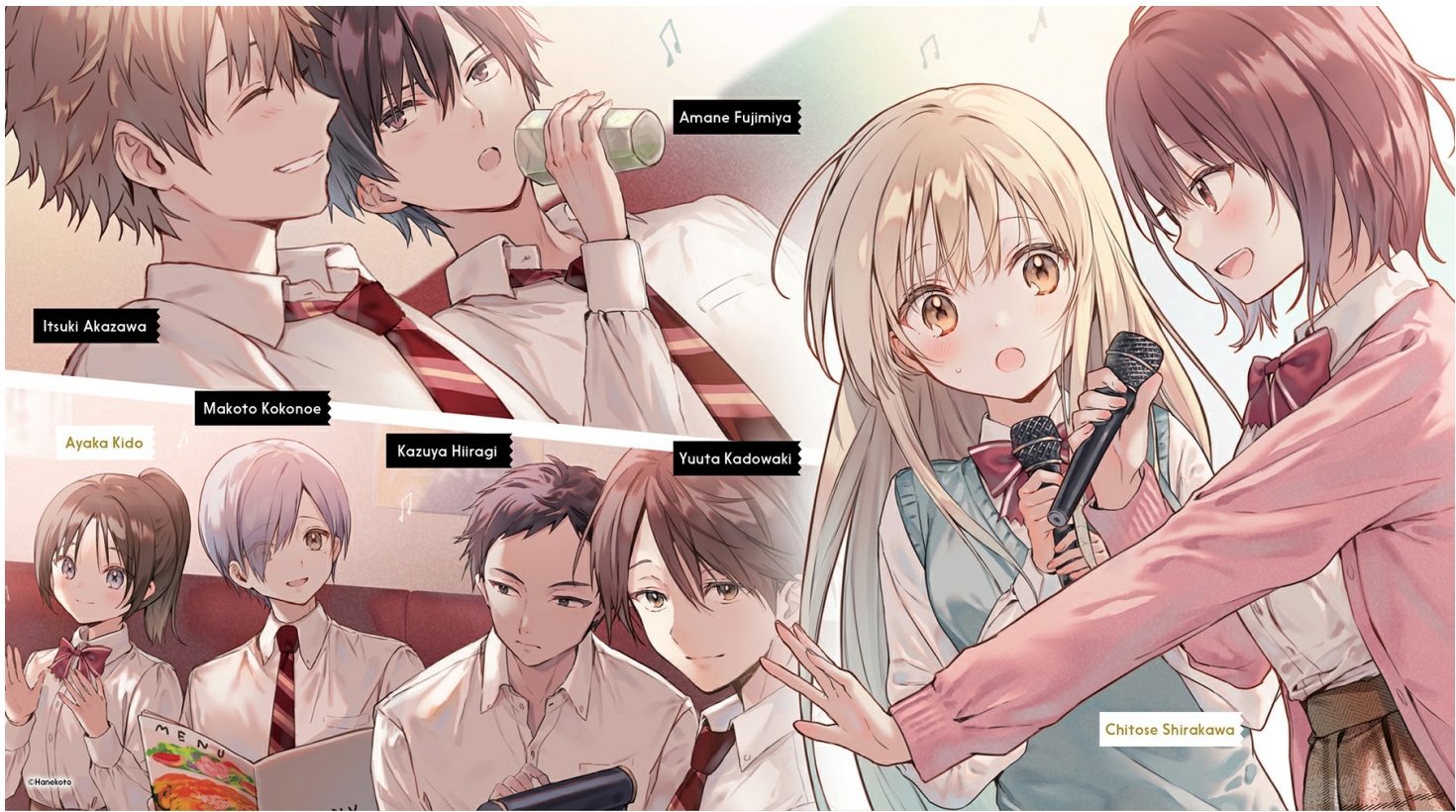
Mahiru Shiina

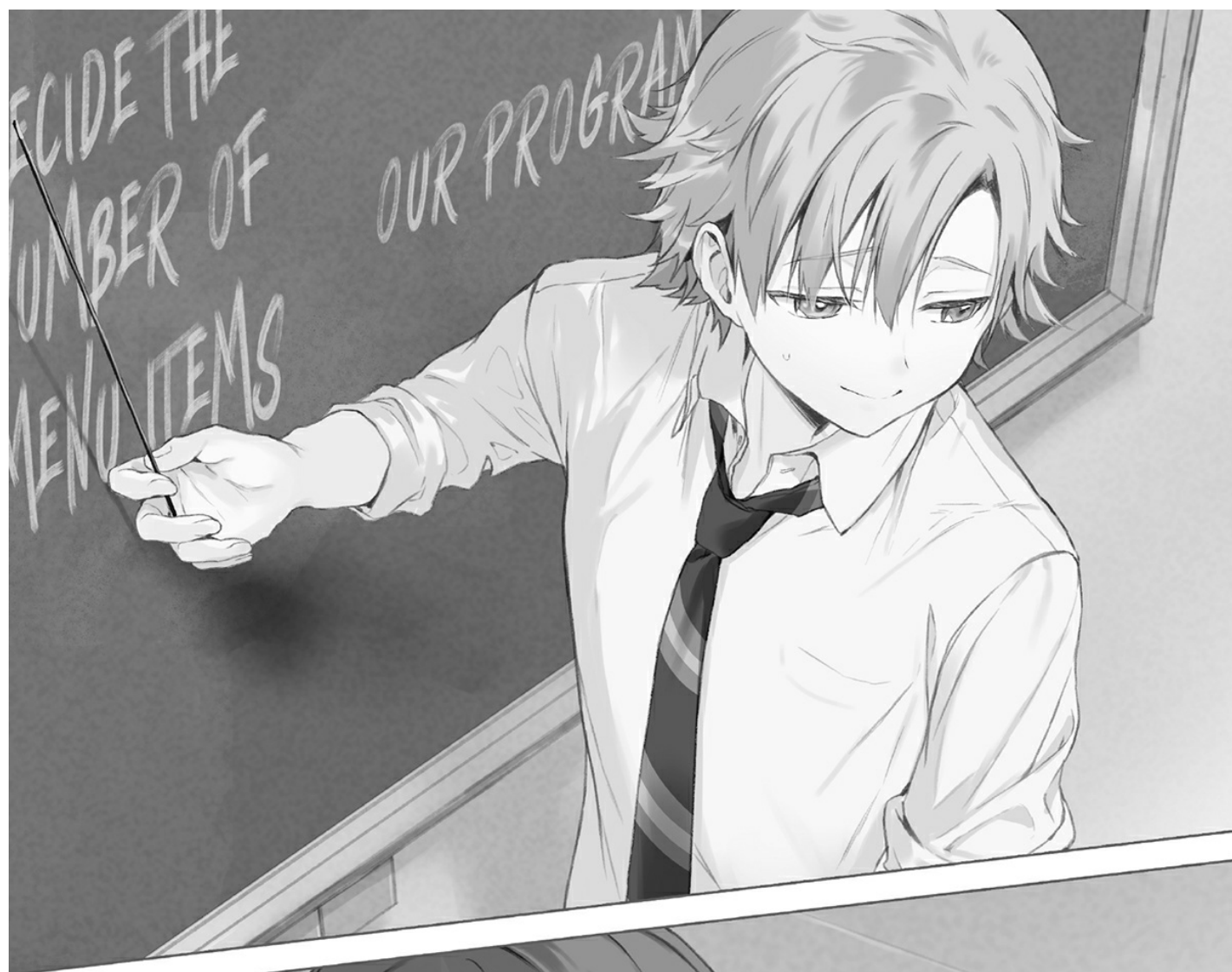
“Ha-ha-ha, I feel like you’re not thinking about the budget at all, but I like the spirit! Okay, for now, let’s put that down as a possibility.”
