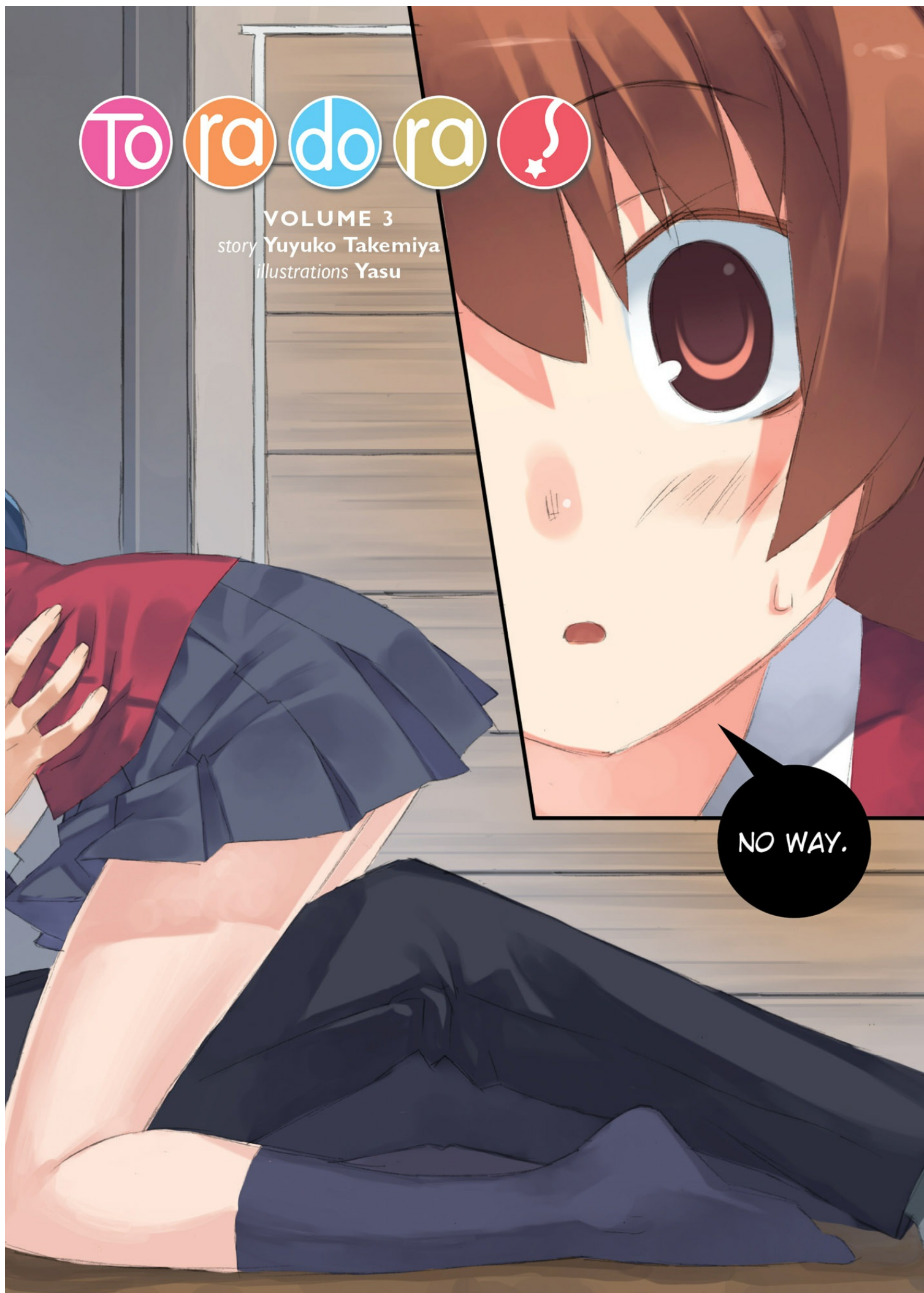
Every chance she gets, she gets close to him and tries to entice him with her sweet voice... W-wait isn't that going too far?!

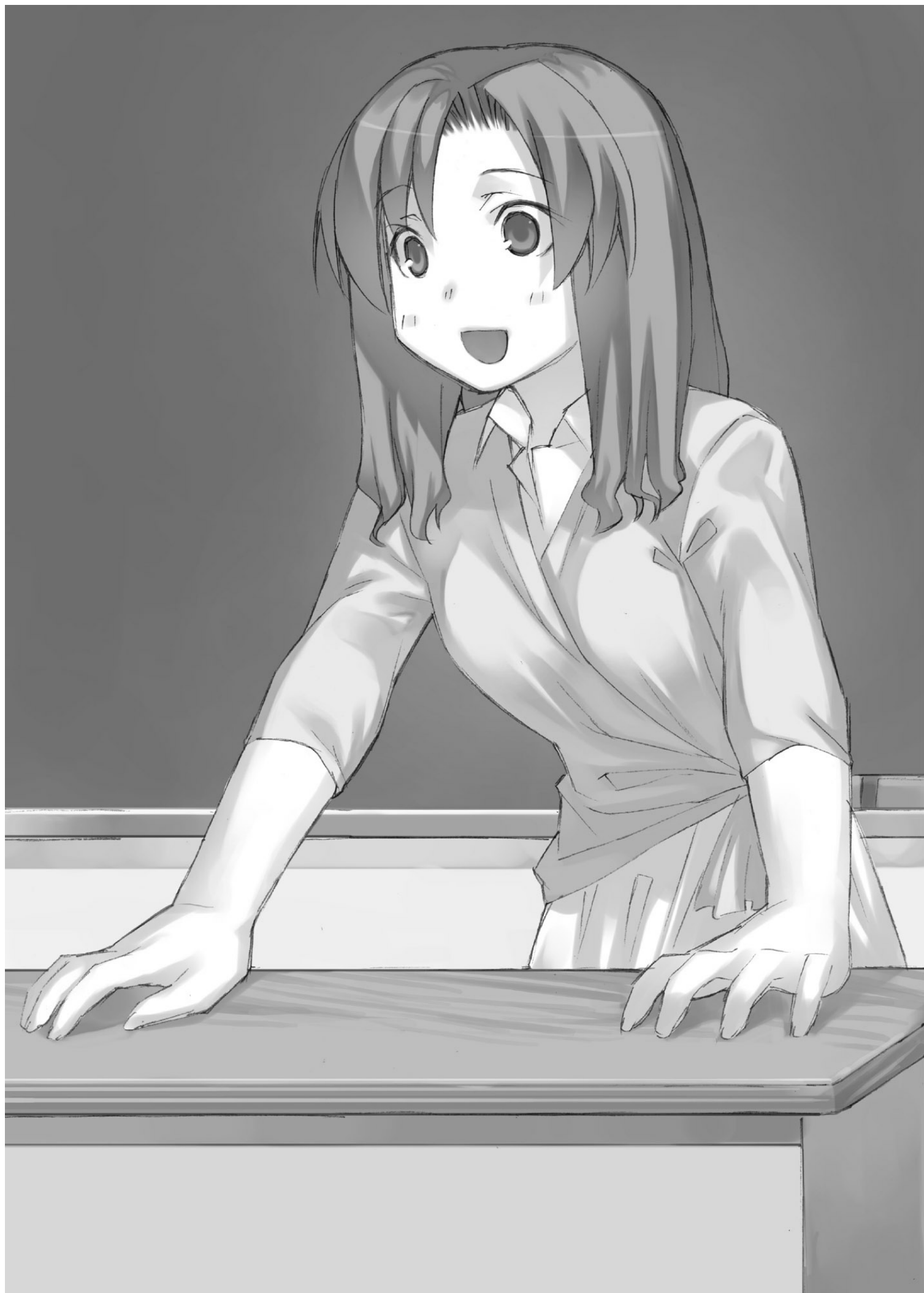
“Because of you, Kitamura-kun thinks we’re *together!*”

She's not here, he'd been thinking the whole time.

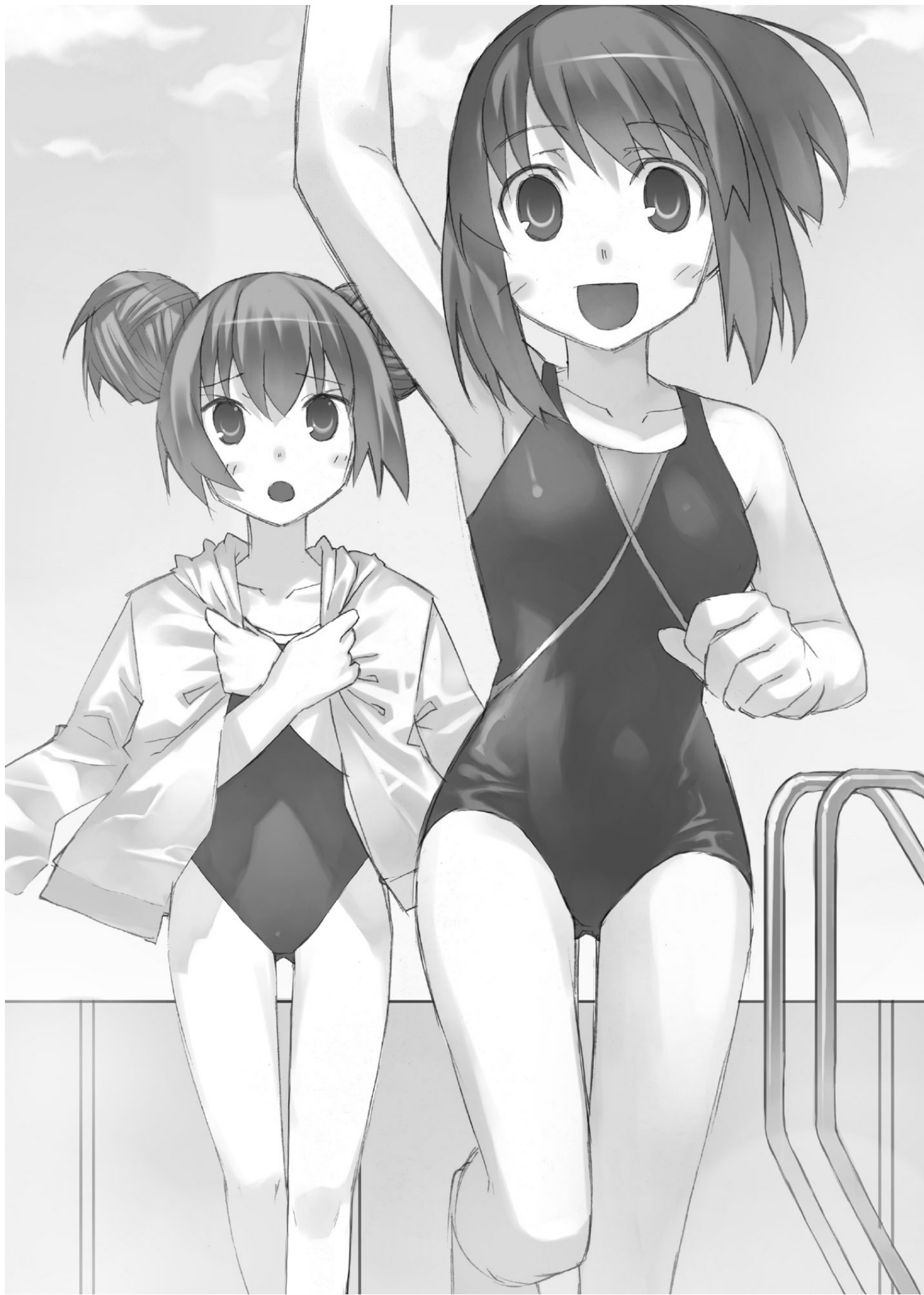
"Oh, Takasu-kuuun! How is it?! Is the water cold?!"

“Eee!”

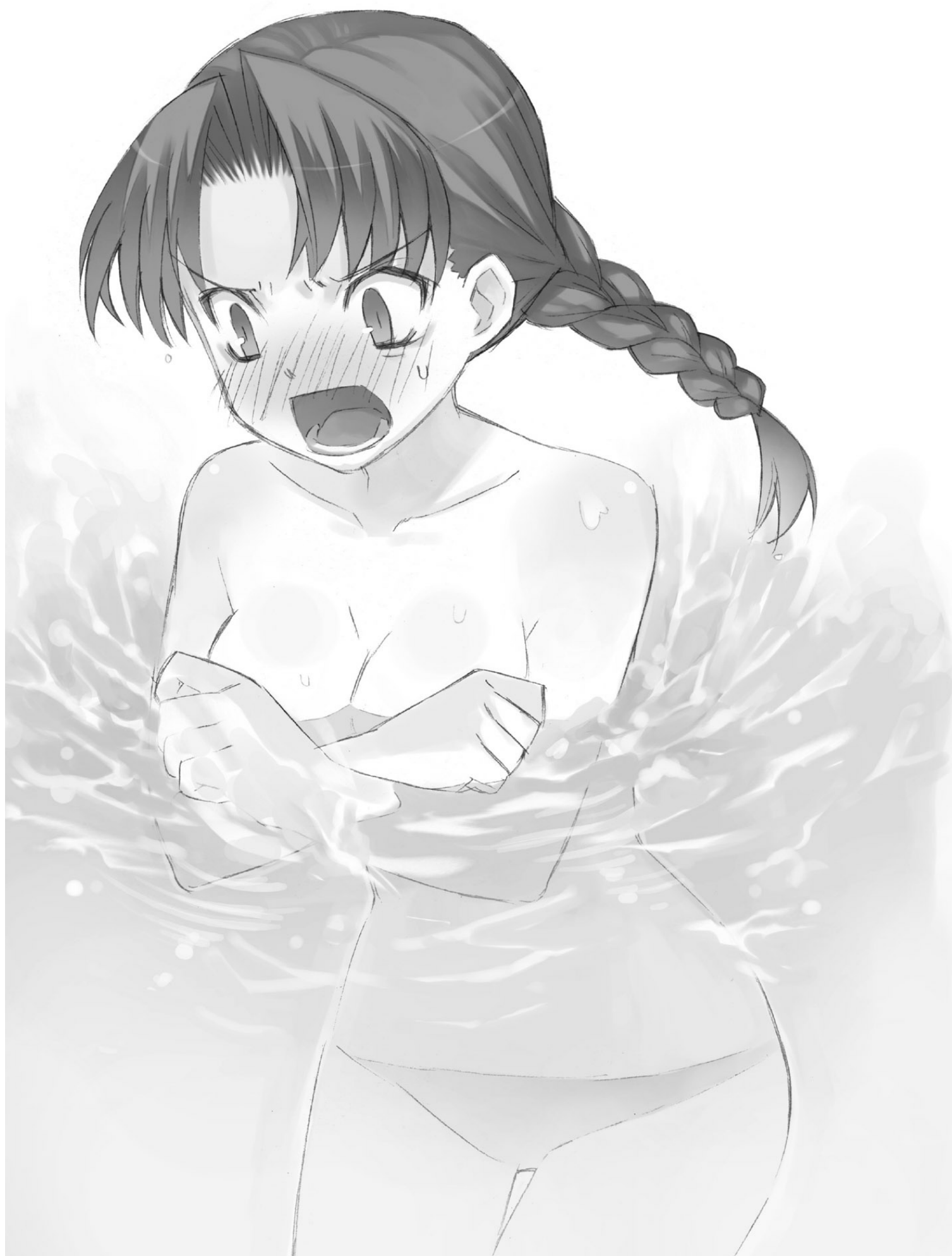
“Like I told you, it’s a dumb bikini. And easy to take off. Both you and the bikini are stupid!”
